

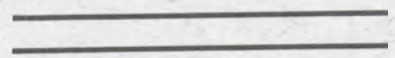
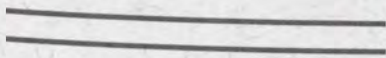

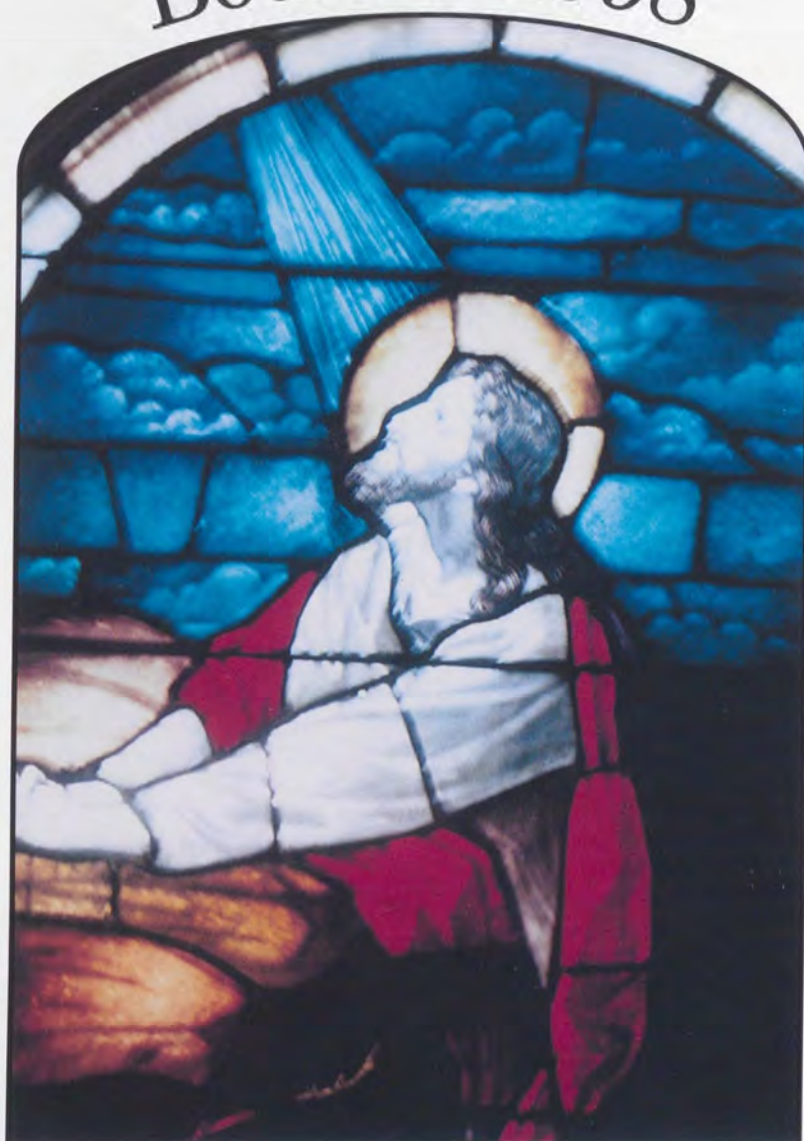

Dick and Lois Wing plan to retire in the 1997-98 school year. Both have worked here since 1978, although Lois was hired about three weeks prior to her husband. She has worked primarily in the financial aid office while he has held ten or so jobs on campus. (Whether that includes his unofficial title of editor-in-residence I don't know).

Dick is a graduate of nearby Letchworth central school and Lois graduated from Warsaw. The couple married on June 9, 1956, shortly after Lois received her RN. They have four children, one daughter, three sons and one grandson.

He attended Cornell for agricultural education and became involved in the R.O.T.C. program there. This involvement led to a career in the Air Force where he served as a pilot in Hawaii, Germany, England and Vietnam. He also became the editor of an Air Force magazine while in Germany. Lois and their family accompanied Dick to every station with the exception of Vietnam.

After he retired from the military, the Wings returned to the area where they grew up. They bought the 1824 house and spent a year remodeling before coming to work at Houghton.

I have a feeling retirement does not mean we have seen the last of Dick and Lois Wing. Both are active in Castile Baptist Church where many Houghton students attend. They are also involved with the Gideons and speak in churches, sometimes as far away as Elmira and Binghamton. Perhaps retirement will give Dr. Wing a chance to do more of his excellent chicken barbecues.
