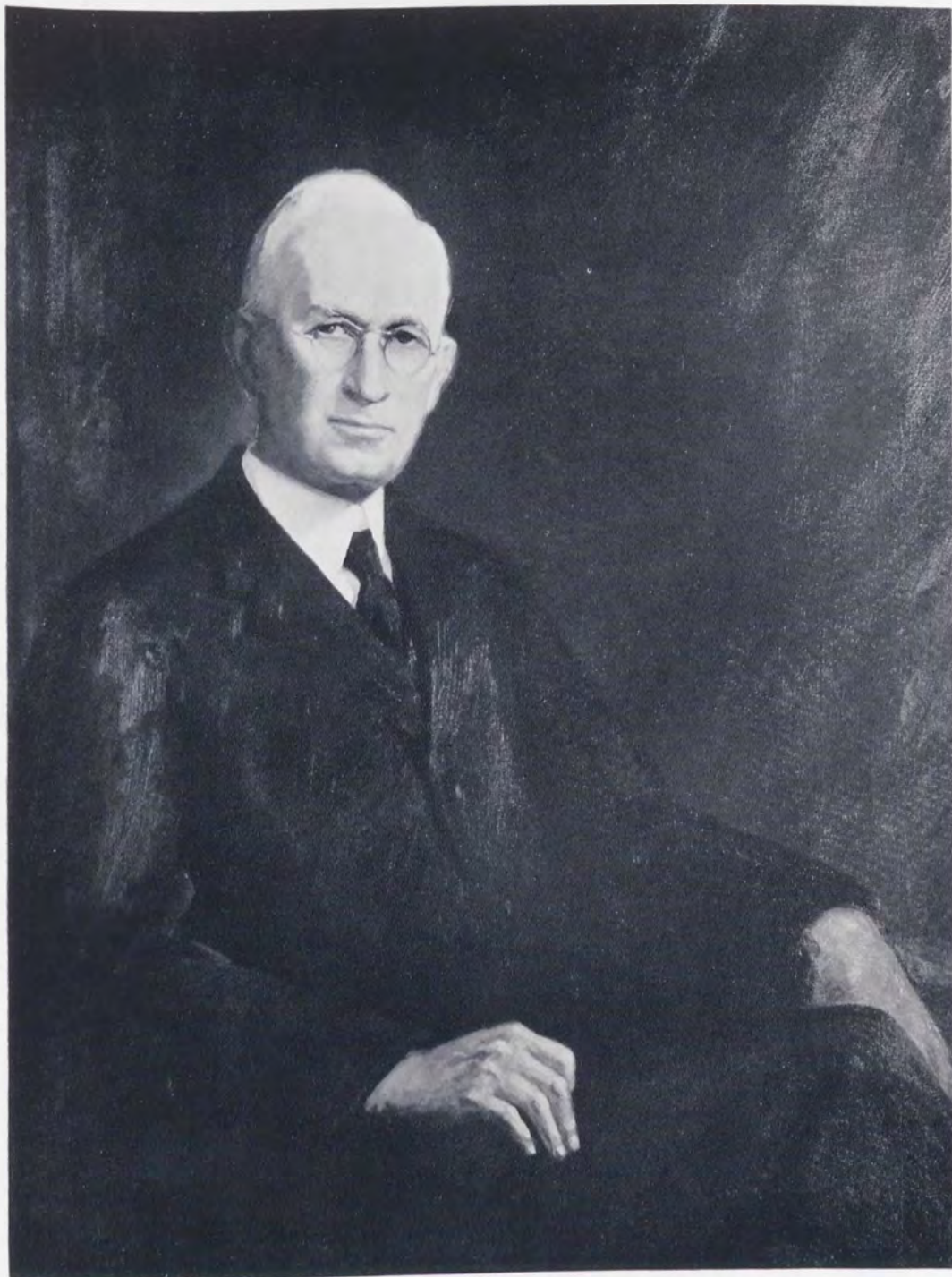

Is all the crown and glory that it asks.*

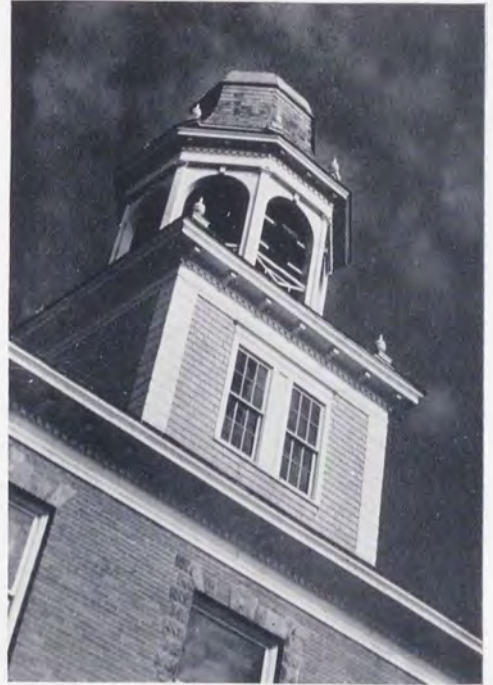

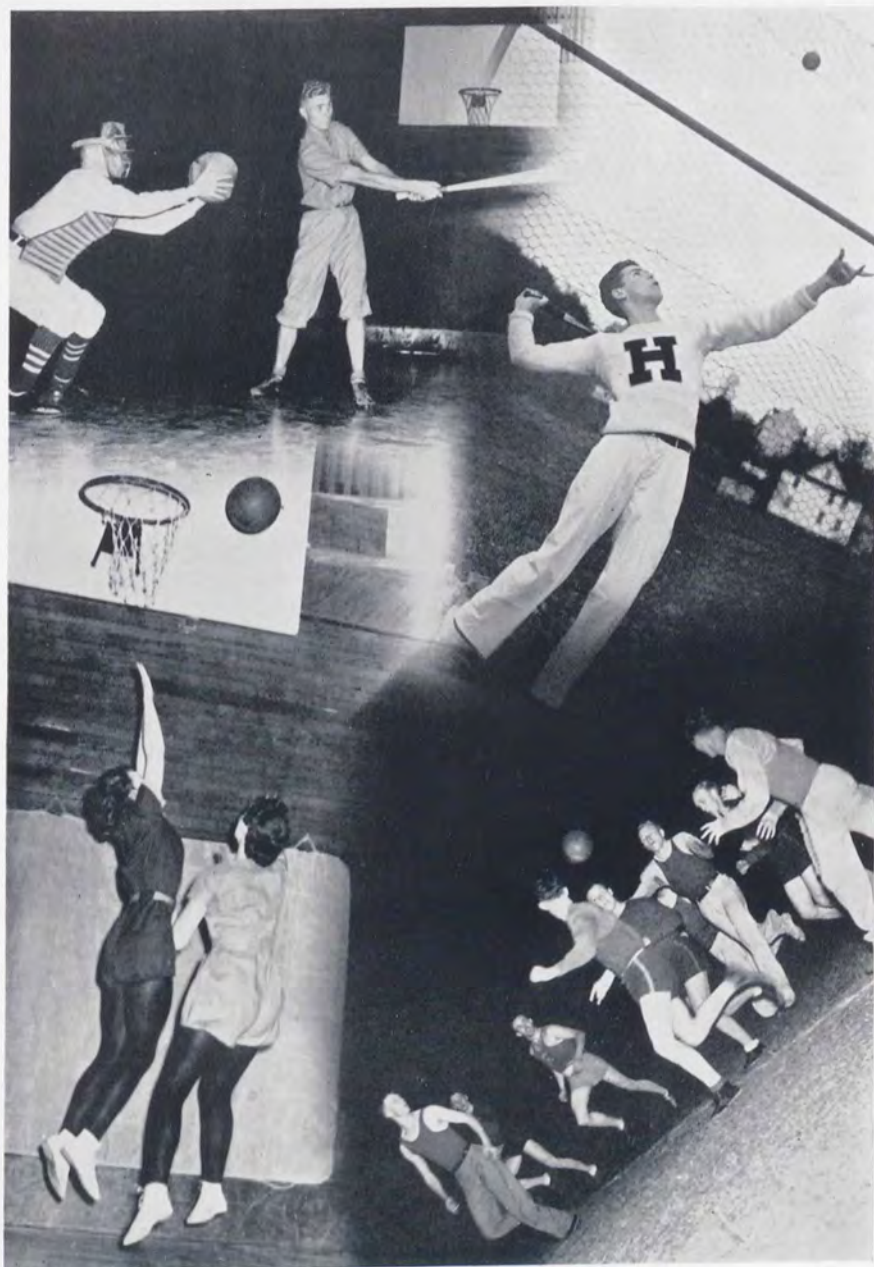
