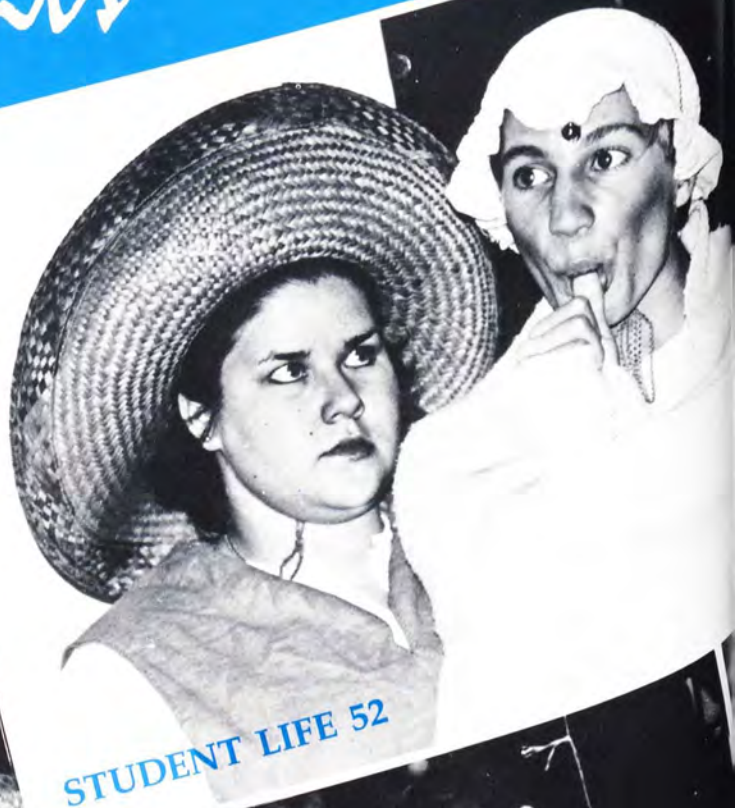

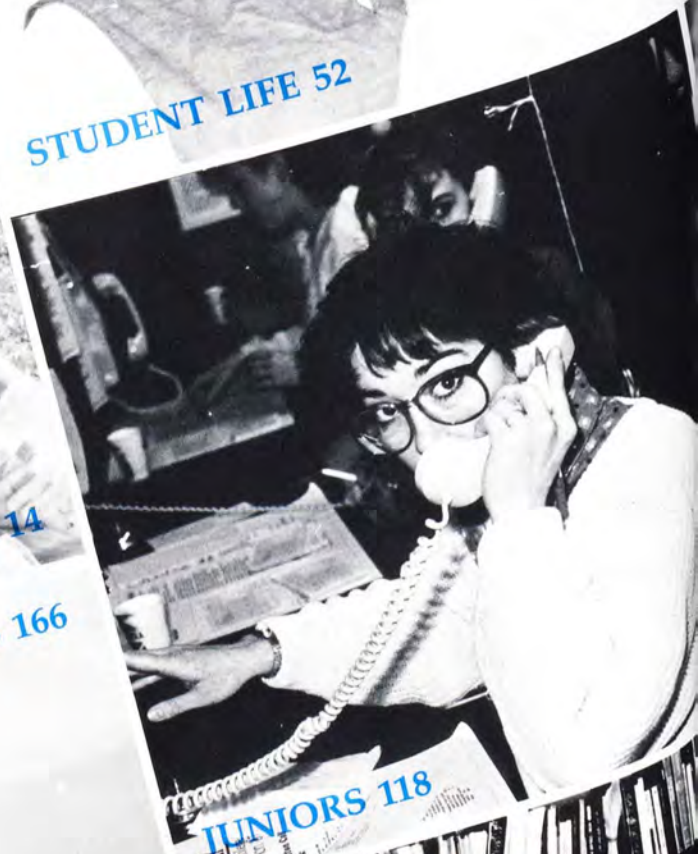

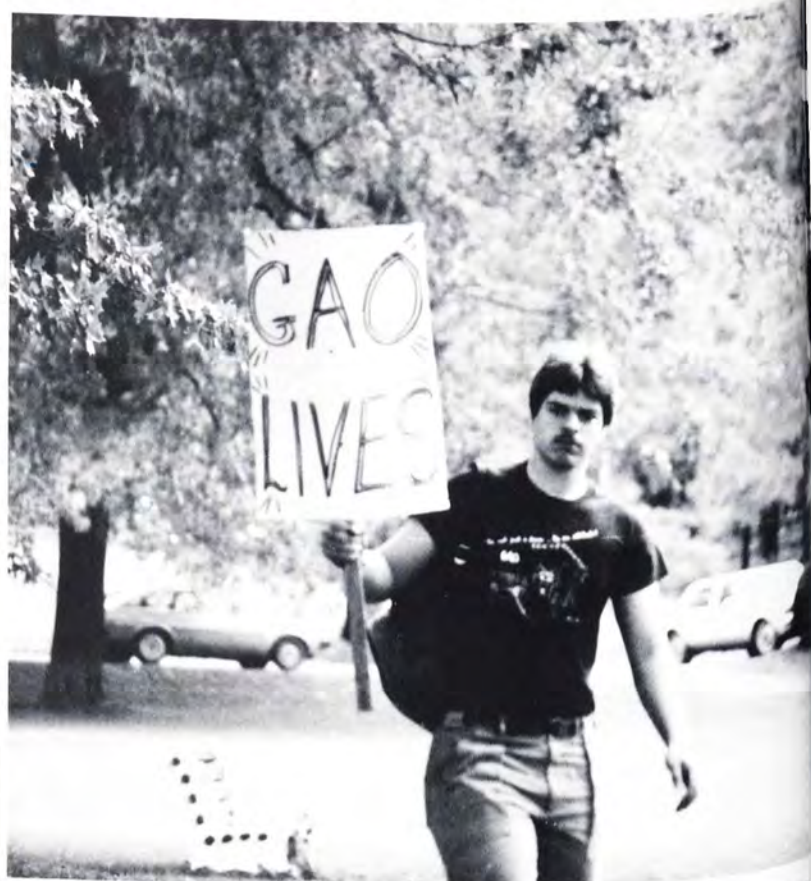
The 1986-'87 year brought many changes to the Houghton College campus. The new men's dorm was completed and occupied, but not named. The old Gao dormitory, loved by all her residents throughout the years, was finally razed, despite the banners and cries of "Save Gao!" at the new dorm's dedication. On the bright side, the destruction of Gao marks the beginning of new construction: a new classroom and office building to be where Fancher and Woolsey buildings now stand.

Another addition to the campus is the eagle monument in front of the campus center. The structure of six soaring eagles commemorates the six students who died in an auto accident in the fall of 1981.

For the first time this year the gymnasium was opened on Sunday—for two hours in the afternoon. This breakthrough was considered by some as revolutionary and by others as an omen of degradation.

In a year of firsts, the language department saw its last year as a separate division; from now on, there will be a single "division of languages and literature."

During the fall semester we were brought a sequence of messages on Philippians; each Tuesday a different faculty member or guest speaker taught on a section of the book.

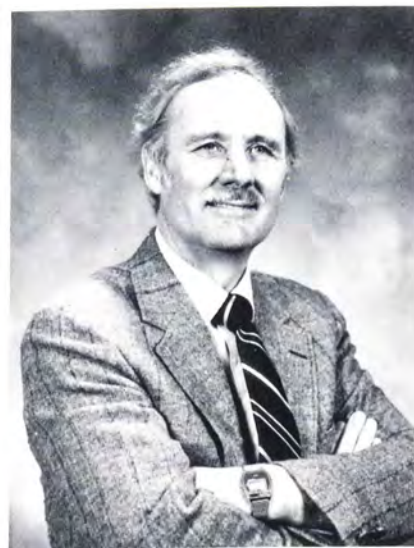

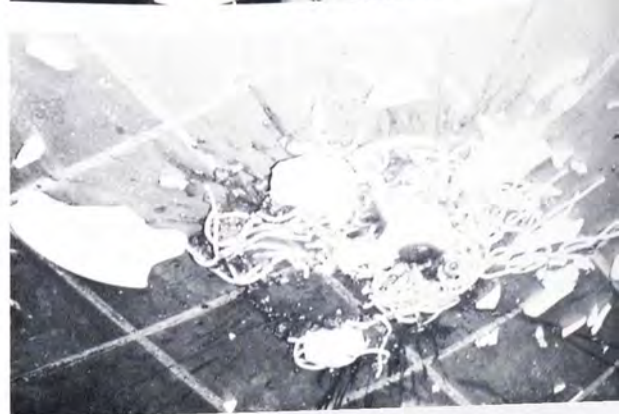

This effort was the brainchild of effervescent young Kirk Sabine, who came to this college partly for that reason: to introduce us to the sport of volleyball, a game of which many Houghton residents had never heard. Unfortunately, the team could only remain a "club," being its first organized year, and a late year at that—the team became prepared to play just as the leagues in the area were beginning to wind down. As a result, they only played one match, mostly for experience, against Genesee Community College. Next year, they want to begin the season a bit earlier, and they also hope that the team will be granted varsity status.







In their final season of intercollegiate competition, the Houghton College Baseball team ended up with a 3-11 record overall. After spending the early spring break below the Mason Dixie line in a tournament against Warner Southern, Taccoa Falls, Central Wesleyan College, and PCB, the team returned to a cold and rainy Houghton and struggled to complete their schedule against three of the top baseball colleges in Western New York and the school rival, Roberts Wesleyan.

Brian Thompson was the winning pitcher in all three of the Highlander wins and he helped the cause offensively by batting .348 on the year and by leading the team in extra base hits. Paul Cornell poked the ball consistently and managed a .500 on base percentage.

Due to budget cuts in the '87-'88 school year, the baseball team was removed from the intercollegiate sports schedule.

Fall 1986 saw the implementation of a new orientation program for Freshmen — PACE, an acronym for "Providing an Appropriate Context for Education."

The program was designed to help first semester students adjust to college, but PACE also emphasized personal awareness and growth. To fulfill this goal, a group of six or seven Freshmen met once a week for nine weeks. The groups were led by upperclassmen who had gone through a training program the previous Mayterm. Each week the groups would have activities and discussions focusing on a designated topic. The focuses of the sessions varied from spiritual growth, to assessments of one's strengths and weaknesses, to relationships with others, to basic study habits, and even to career planning.

Besides the small group sessions, a large lecture-type session was held every Monday, for nine weeks, to which all new students had to attend. These Monday chats were given by members of the faculty and staff, and the topics of the sessions did not necessarily have to match that week's small group focus.

At the close of the nine week period, the new students and the student leaders were asked to evaluate the program, and just about the only complaint was the very fact that the large sessions did not mesh with the small groups.
