A Note From the Director

This concert was conceived primarily as a tribute to the faithfulness of God. Using contrasting songs of praise and struggle, it explores the many situations in which God's providence and redemption become evident. We open with the African American spiritual "Ain'a that good news!" and bring several other spiritual settings back throughout. This genre of music is particularly evocative of the desperation of being oppressed and enslaved, with Heaven as the ultimate hope for release and freedom. Often the metaphor for this release is crossing a body of water, which you will notice as both a nautical and biblical theme in the music we are presenting tonight. We wish to leave the struggle of existing in this fallen world undiminished, so that God's redemption and goodness will be reflected in equal and overabundant measure. The students will be sharing ways in which this provision has been demonstrated in their lives. As we praise Him with both our bodies and voices, we hope you join us in remembering that the final battle is already won, and that we can walk together in faith as the body of Christ, knowing exactly where we are going.
