## OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR

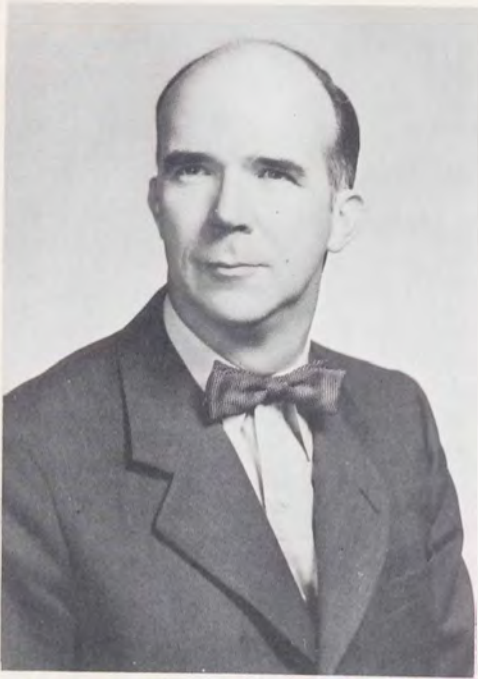

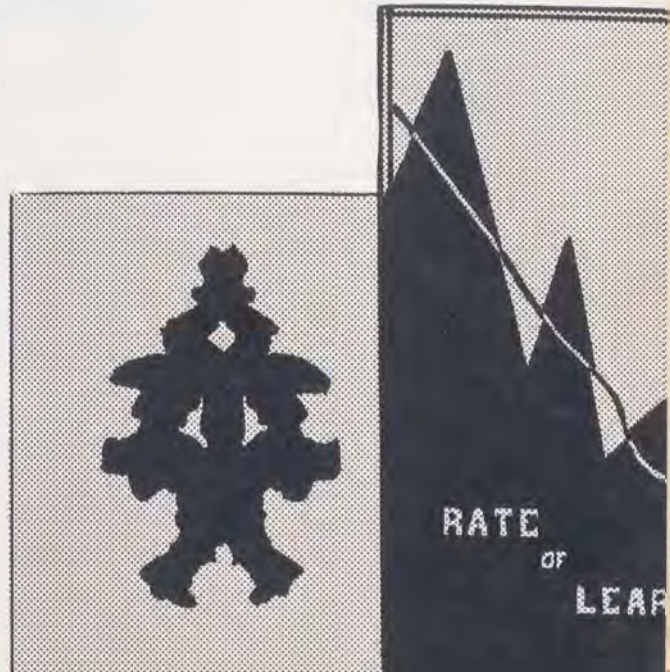
## EDUCATION, AND PSYCHOLOGY

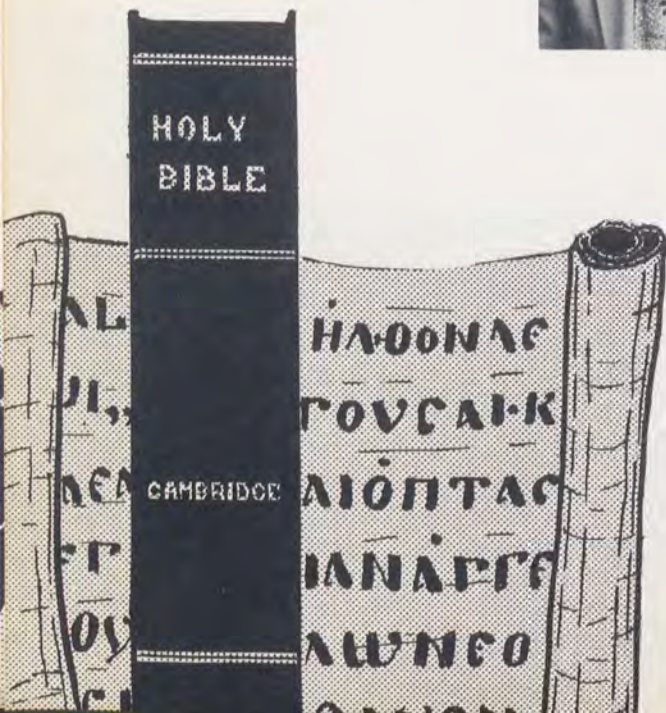
## DIVISION OF THEOLOGY AND CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

## WJSL

WJSL, the campus radio station, is now in its fifth year of broadcasting programs of interest to students and townspeople. The station was plagued by "transmitter troubles" during the early part of the school year, but the installation of a new transmitter this spring has brought these difficulties to an end and facilitated higher broadcast quality than was possible in past years.

Aside from the regular broadcasting and programming activities, an amateur radio club has been established to help students obtain their amateur radio licenses and to give them practical experience in building and operating a shortwave transmitter.



## RADIO CLUB

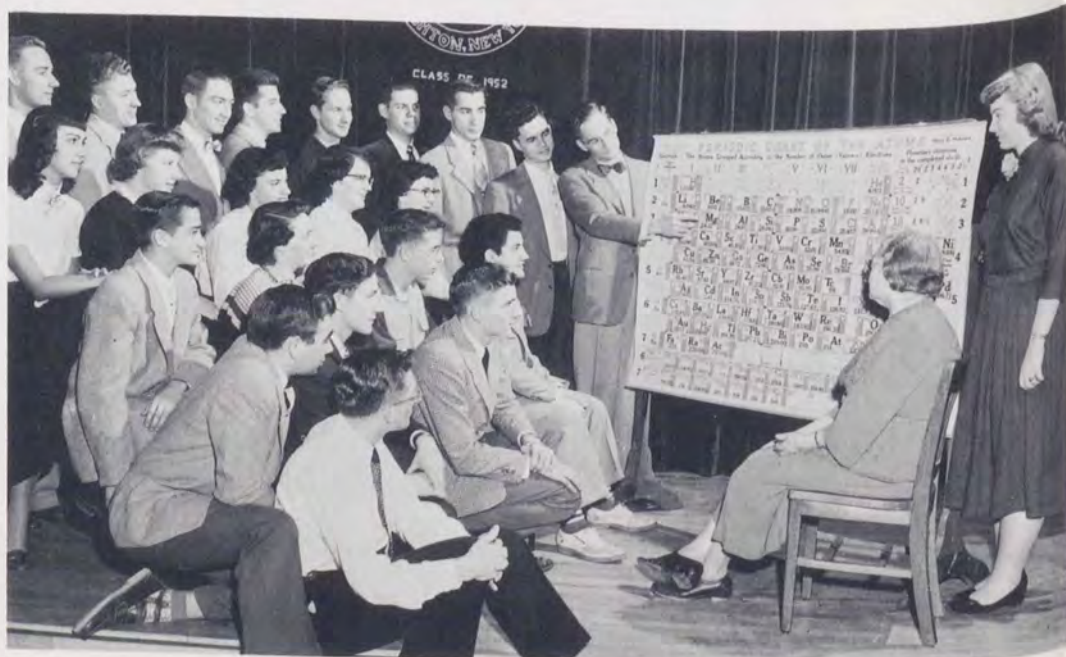

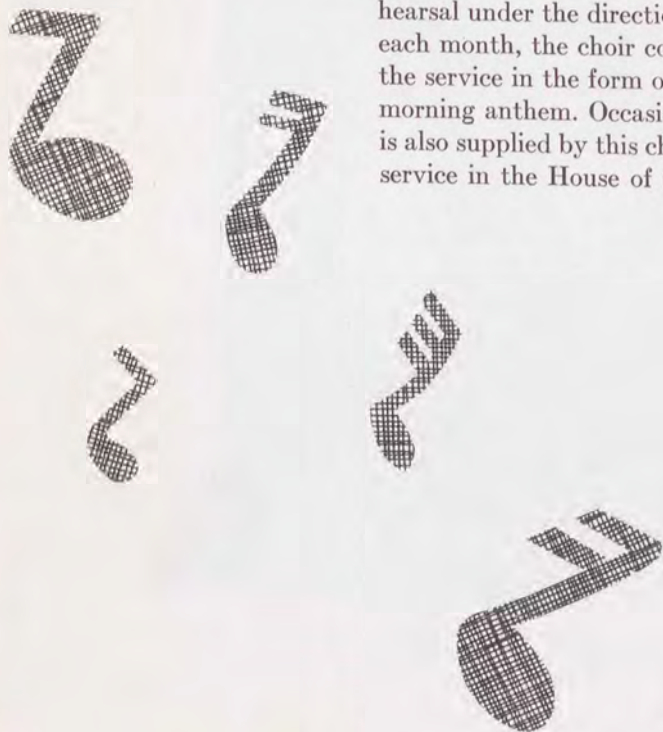
## CHAPEL CHOIR


The Plan benefits students
