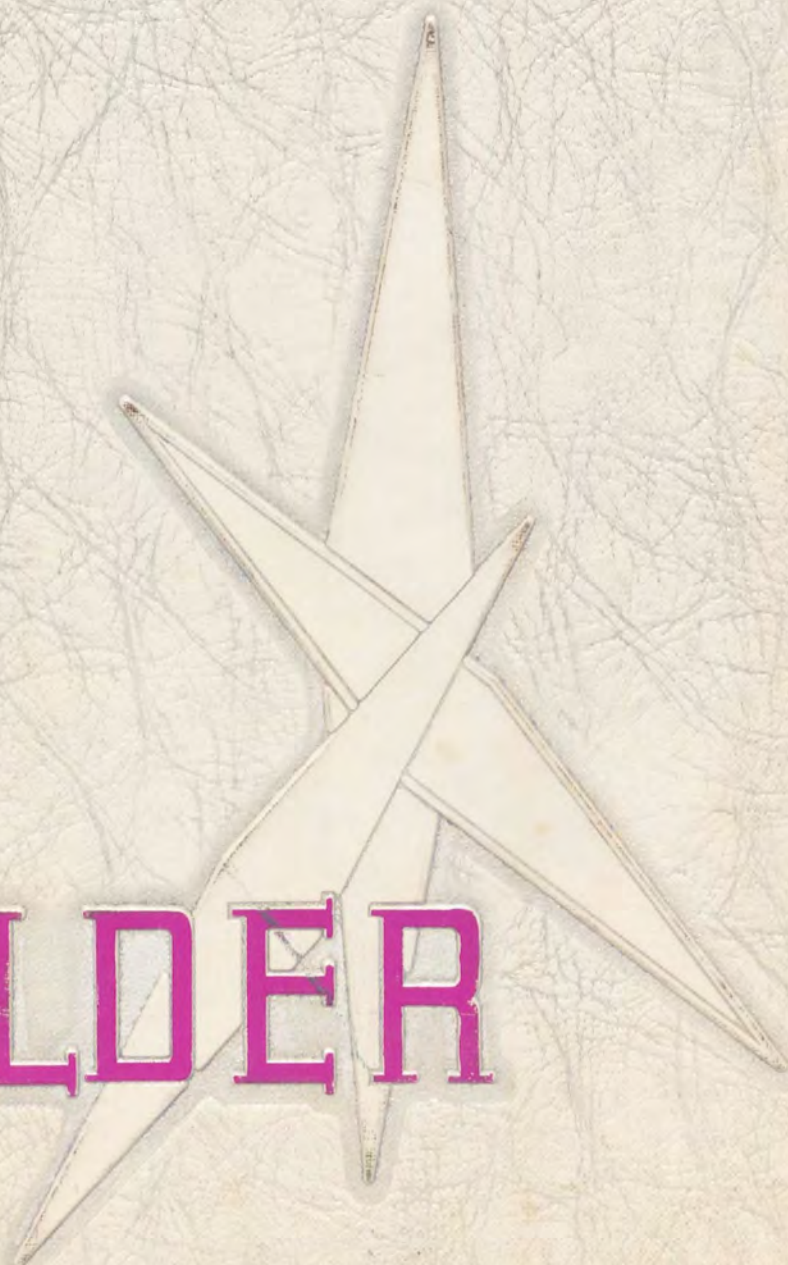

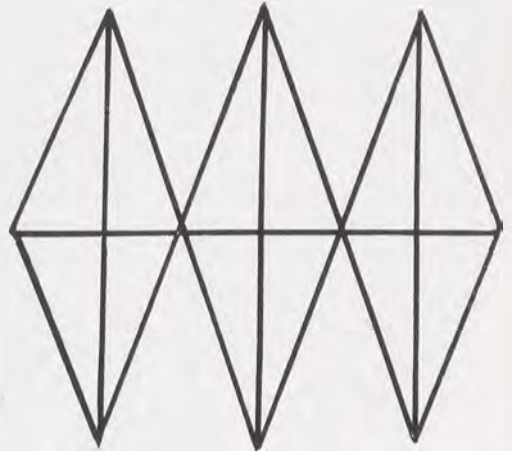

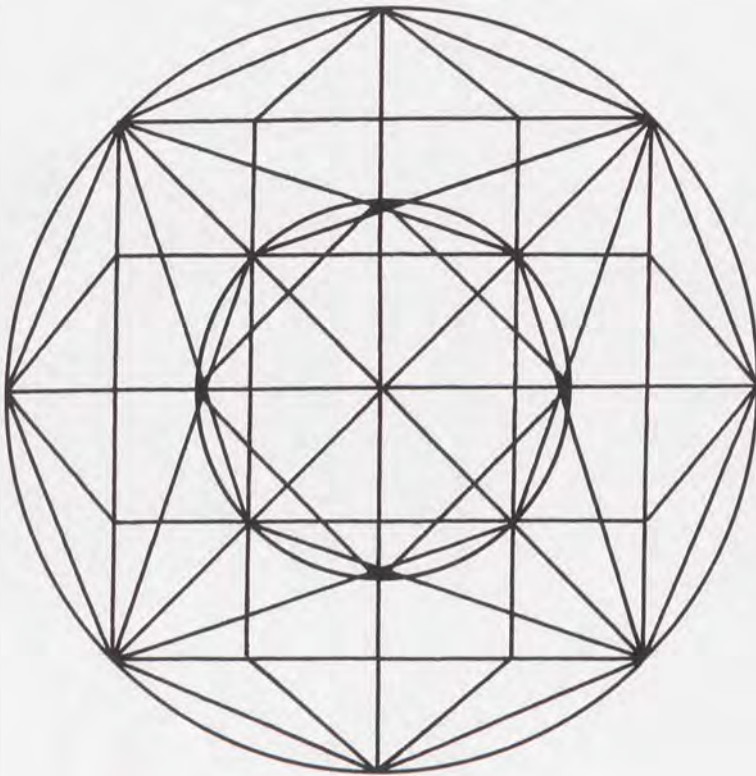

So the college student is marked and guided by a dedicated ADMINISTRATION to the full development of the many facets of his personality.

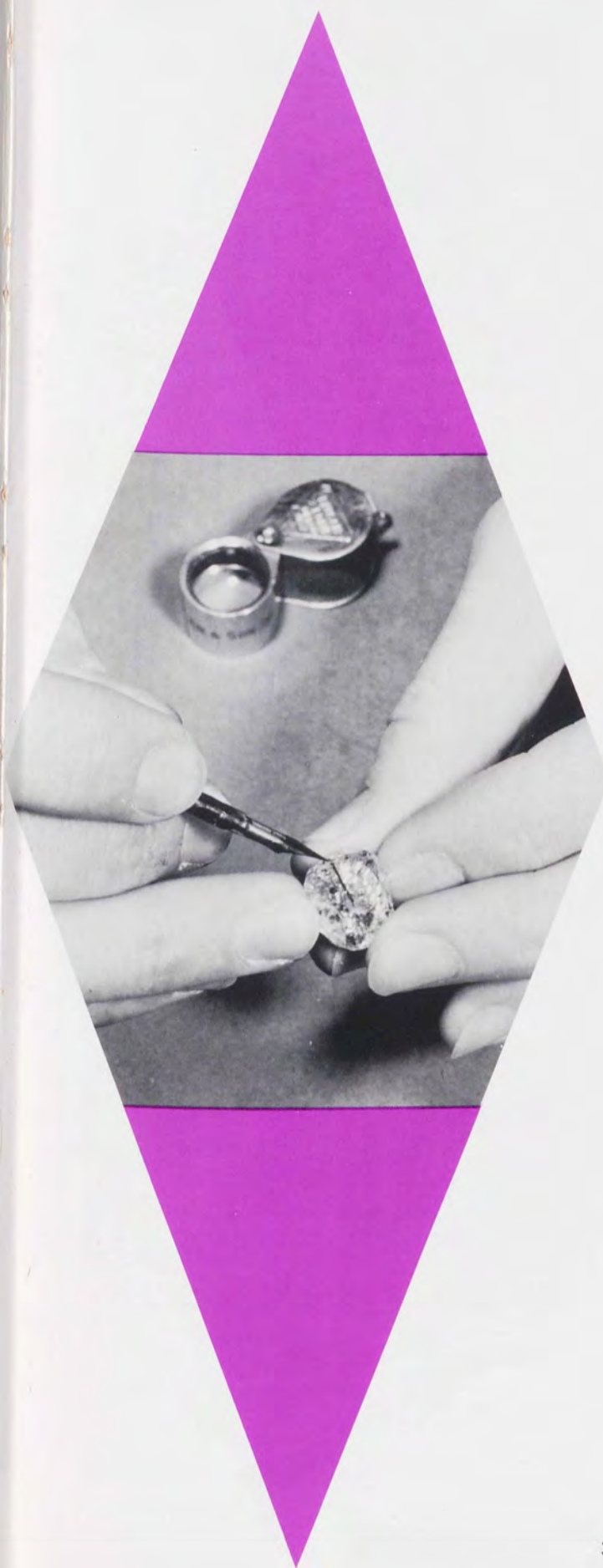
The Diamond

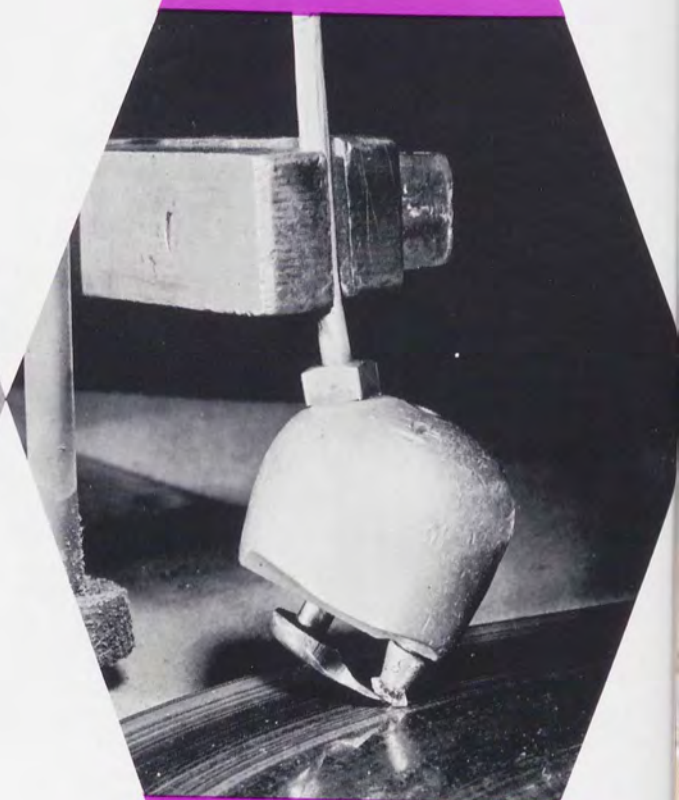
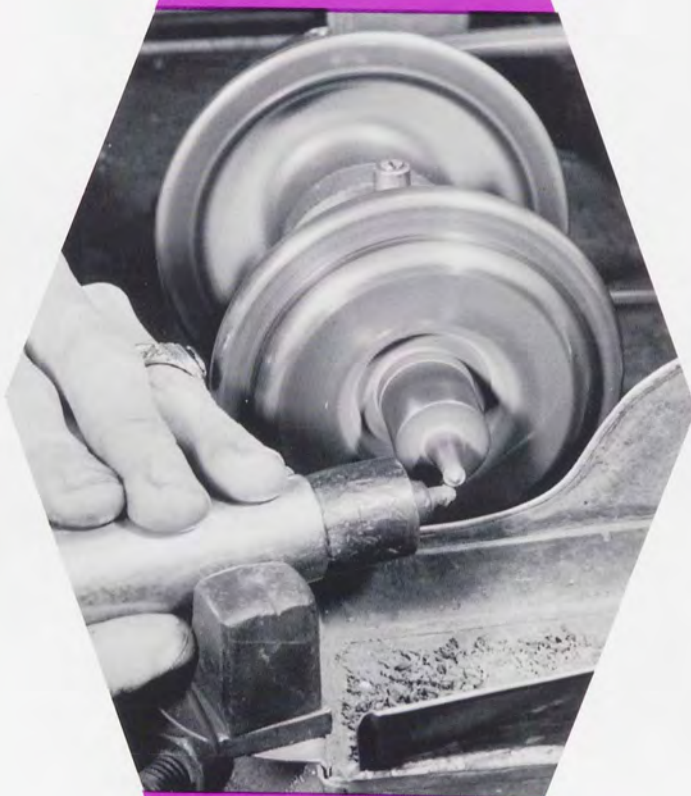
CLEAVING AND SAWING

IN MEMORIAM



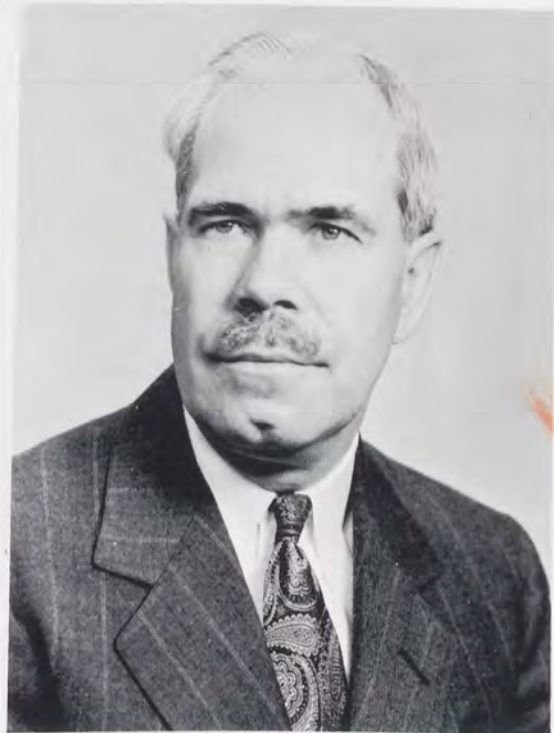
Through twenty-seven years of steady, thorough teaching, Professor Alfred Daniel Kreckman helped to build the present well-recognized Department of Music.

When the meek inherit the earth, Dr. Woolsey's portion will indeed be great.



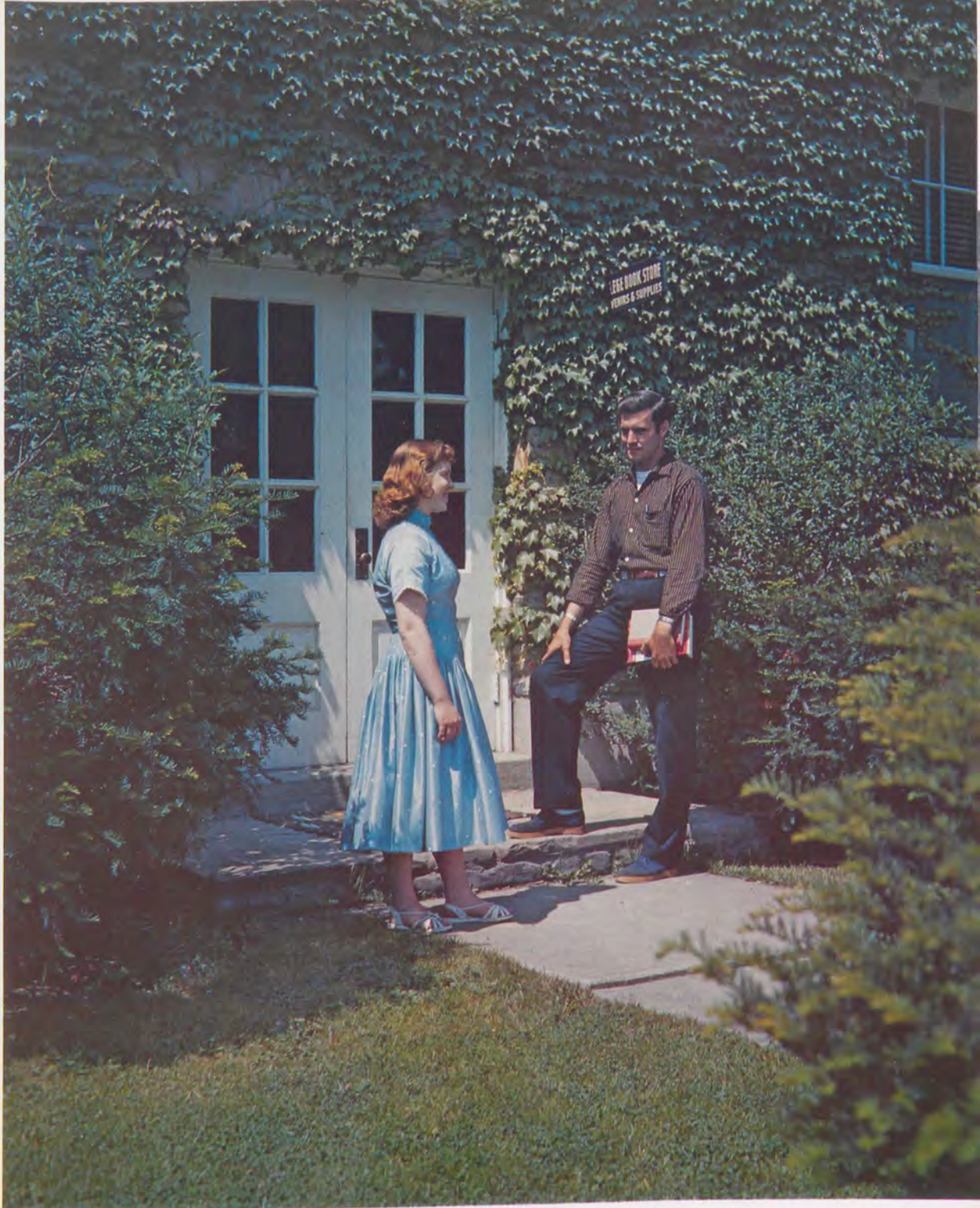
