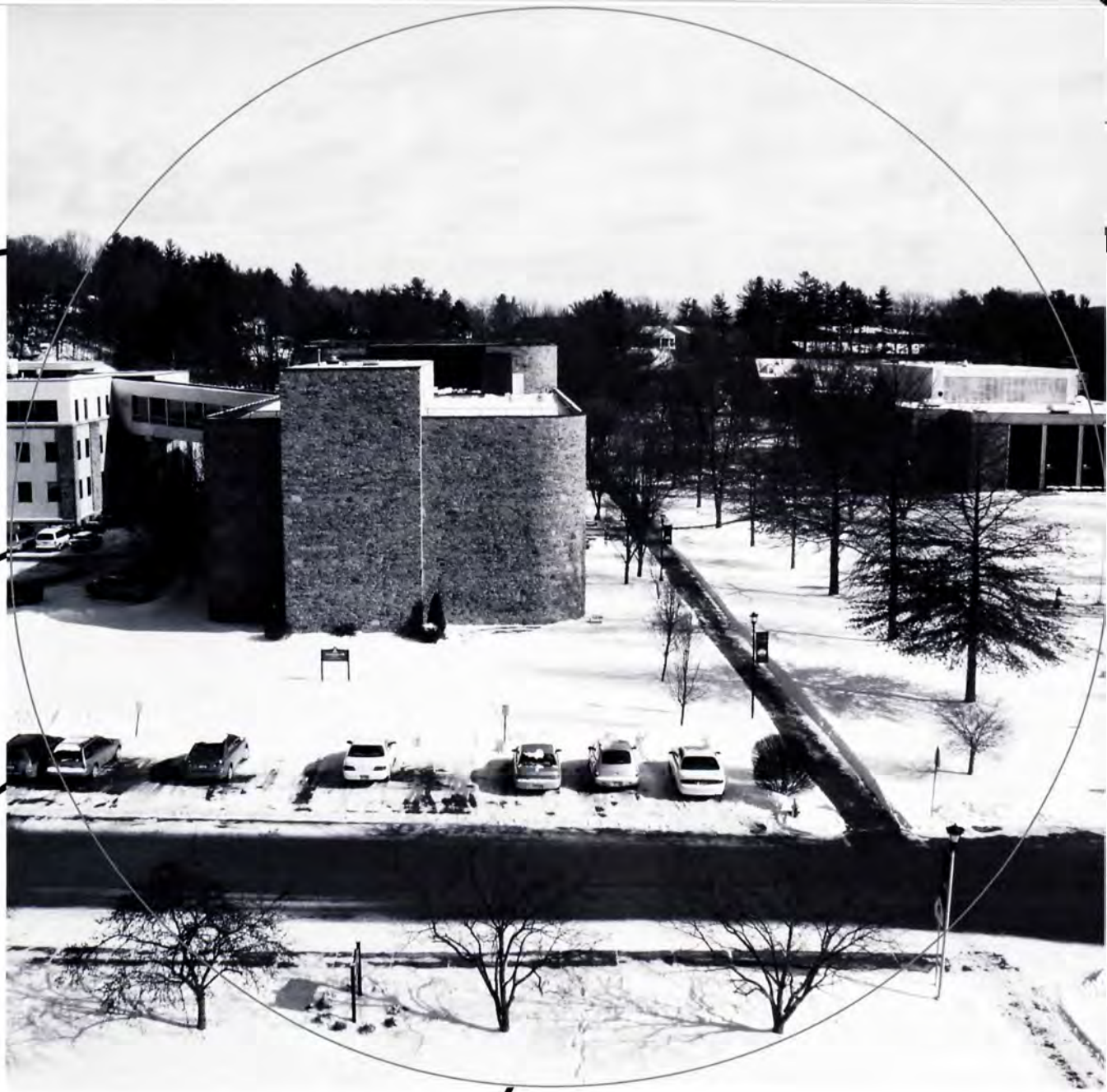

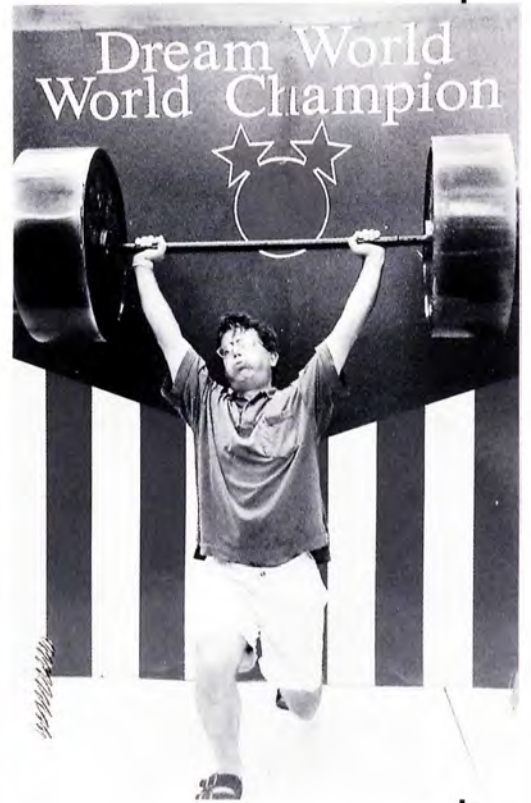
Dr. Brubaker is the epitome of the "scholar-servant." He not only offers Houghton his perspective as a professor in the biology department, but he also is the man who diagnoses our illnesses and treats us when we are sick. Not only is Dr. Brubaker involved in the community in an academic and professional manner, he is also involved on a more personal level. One student calls the Brubaker family her "host family" – a type of support system for missionary kids whose parents are overseas. Dr. Brubaker was even involved in the play "Our Town," picking up the role he had when he was a Houghton student.

There was one anecdote that simply clinched the deal for us. A little over a year ago the Houghton College Shakespeare Players were performing Macbeth. It was the last performance and energy levels were high. During the final fight scene between Macduff and Macbeth, the student playing Macbeth was accidentally cut on his hand with a sword. As soon as the play was finished and the lights came back on Dr. Brubaker was right there, pulling the student away and taking him over to the Health Center to stitch him up – at nine o'clock in the evening. The student was back in time to finish greeting play-goers in the receiving line. Not only was Dr. Brubaker attending a play with his family, soaking up Houghton community, but he was ready and willing to go out of his way to open up the Health Center by himself to tend to the injured student.

In short, Dr. Brubaker embodies the great diversity of the people who serve at Houghton and we want to express our gratitude and appreciation.

The Houghton College Men's Basketball team recorded a 7-19 record during the 2007-2008 season. In addition to wins over the College of St. Joseph's, SUNY Canton, SUNY Fredonia, Ohio University at Lancaster, and Paul Smith's College, another team highlight included a close loss to AMC North title contender Daemen College at home after losing by thirty away from Houghton. Ahmed 'Mada' Abdelhamid and Yannick Anzuluni led the team in scoring, averaging 15 and 14 points per game respectively.

The squad graduates two seniors: guard Jon Van Skiver and forward Rimgaudas Valaitis. Both players will be remembered as accurate three point shooters; Van Skiver drained seven in a game against Redeemer University in 2005, while Valaitis' eight against Myers University in 2006 ranks second in Houghton history. The contributions of these two players were crucial to the Highlanders' perennial finish near the top of the AMC in three point field goals made.

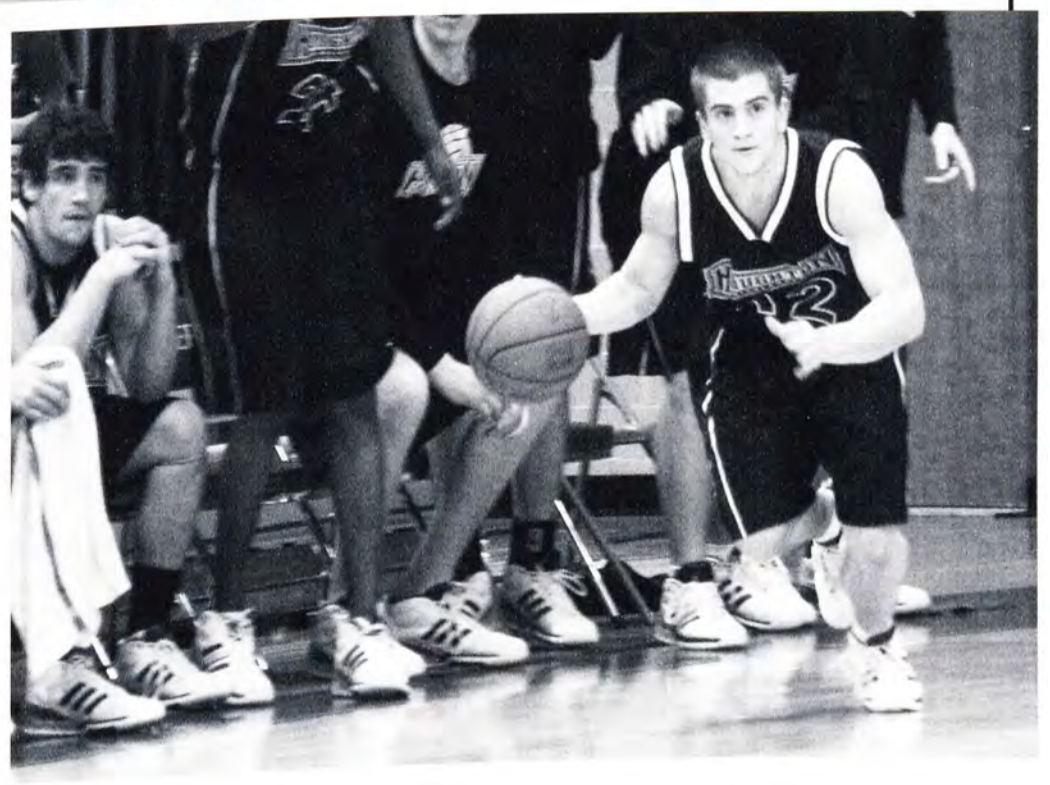

Finishing 15-12 overall, including a winning conference record, the Houghton College Women's Basketball team qualified for the AMC Conference Tournament for the first time since 2003. Led by seniors Ashley Scudder, Cassie Merrill, and Rebecca Kallal, all of whom saw regular minutes for the past four years, the Highlanders defeated tough conference foes Point Park University and Roberts Wesleyan College en route to the playoffs. The American Mid-East Conference Freshman of the Year, Houghton center Ashley Dupler, broke Houghton's single-season record for blocked shots while averaging 14 points and 8 rebounds per game.

Scudder, a team captain, will be missed for her all-around play; her tough rebounding and defense against the opposition's best player will need to be replaced. Both Kallal and Merrill earned their reputation as clutch three-point shooters; in addition to shooting a high percentage, the threat they posed on the perimeter cautioned opponents from double-teaming Dupler in the post. The leadership, skills, and attitudes of these three seniors were honored prior to the team's final home game.

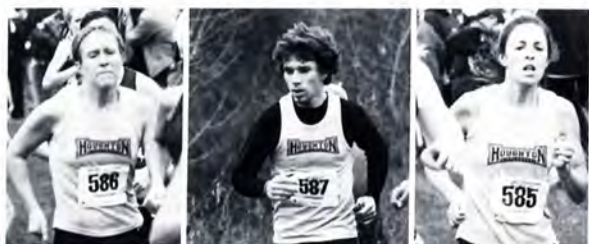

Three members of the 2007 Houghton College Cross-Country team earned the opportunity to compete at the NAIA Cross-Country National Championship. While Dan Ballard competed in the men's race for the second consecutive year, Rachel Rhodes and Kaitlin Fadden ran in their first cross-country National Championship. Ballard finished 48th out of 258 participants, while Fadden and Rhodes finished 92nd and 133rd out of 268, respectively. Ballard, Fadden, and Rhodes were also named to the All-AMC Cross-Country Team.

Three Highlanders were selected to the NAIA Scholar Athlete list, which honors a junior or senior athlete who has maintained a 3.5 academic average or higher. Dan Ballard, Lydia Thorneblade, and Irene Vickner earned this prestigious award. The team graduates five seniors: Michael Platt, Joe Campagna, Rachel Rhodes, Irene Vickner, and Heather Hutton.

The 2007 Houghton Field Hockey team capped off an impressive end to its season by winning its postseason tournament with convincing victories over St. Vincent College and Wells College. The team improved as the season progressed; the team avenged an early 3-1 loss to Seton Hill University by defeating the Griffins 1-0 in late September on a goal by sophomore Ashley Hoffman. At the end of the twenty game season, Hoffman led the team in goals with 15, while freshman attacker Sarah Buckwalter followed close behind with 14. Goalie Ashley Farr held the opposition to an average of fewer than 3 goals per game while leading the team to an 11-9 overall record. Seniors Elizabeth Mueller, Ashley Pink, Katie Griego and junior Arryn Prince anchored a veteran defense that limited opponents' chances against Farr. Mueller, Pink, and Griego are the lone graduating seniors.

The Houghton College Men's Soccer team finished the season with a record of 9-4-5 and advanced to the semifinals of the NAIA Region IX playoffs. Although the Highlanders fell to Rio Grande University in the semifinal, Houghton had beaten the regional champions at Rio Grande in late September, 2-1. A second highlight of the season occurred when the squad defeated Roberts Wesleyan College in the quarterfinals of the regional tournament, led by the inspired play of midfielder Jonathan Brooks.

The men's team graduates five seniors, including Tyler Haggerty, Ernie Walton, and Josiah Snelgrove, who have seen meaningful minutes for four years. In addition to junior goalkeeper Erik Lefebvre, Haggerty and Snelgrove were selected to the All-Region IX team.

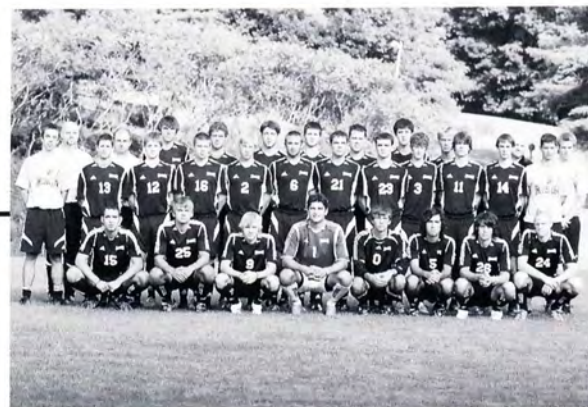
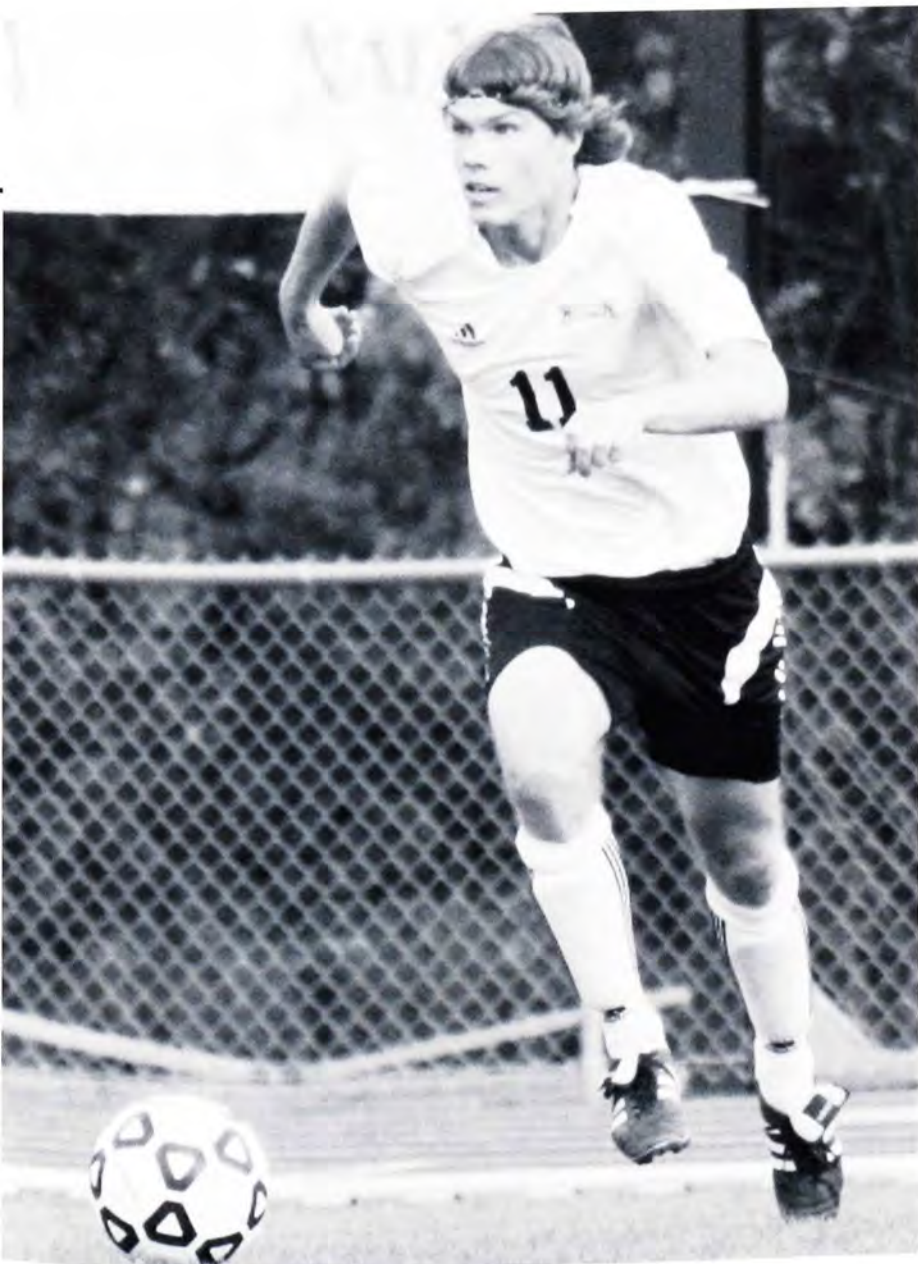

Advancing to the second round of the NAIA National Tournament, the Houghton College Women's Soccer team increased its streak of consecutive Nationals appearances to five. Led by junior forward Hannah Swift, the NAIA Region IX and AMC Player of the Year, the squad finished with a record of 13-3-3 overall and an undefeated 7-0-0 record in the AMC North Division. Despite losing to third-seeded Azusa Pacific in the National Tournament, the Highlanders eliminated Cornerstone University in the first round as goalkeeper Lauren Foster registered the clean sheet.

Six seniors will move on, including Rebecca Smith, an honorable mention selection to the NSCAA and NAIA All-American team. Foster, the senior goalie, led the team to a 10-1-2 record while sharing minutes. Andrea Duryea, an athletic midfielder, will be missed because of her pace and decision making. Sarah Whipple, Erin Ross, and Ashley Laboda graduated as well.

Track and Field



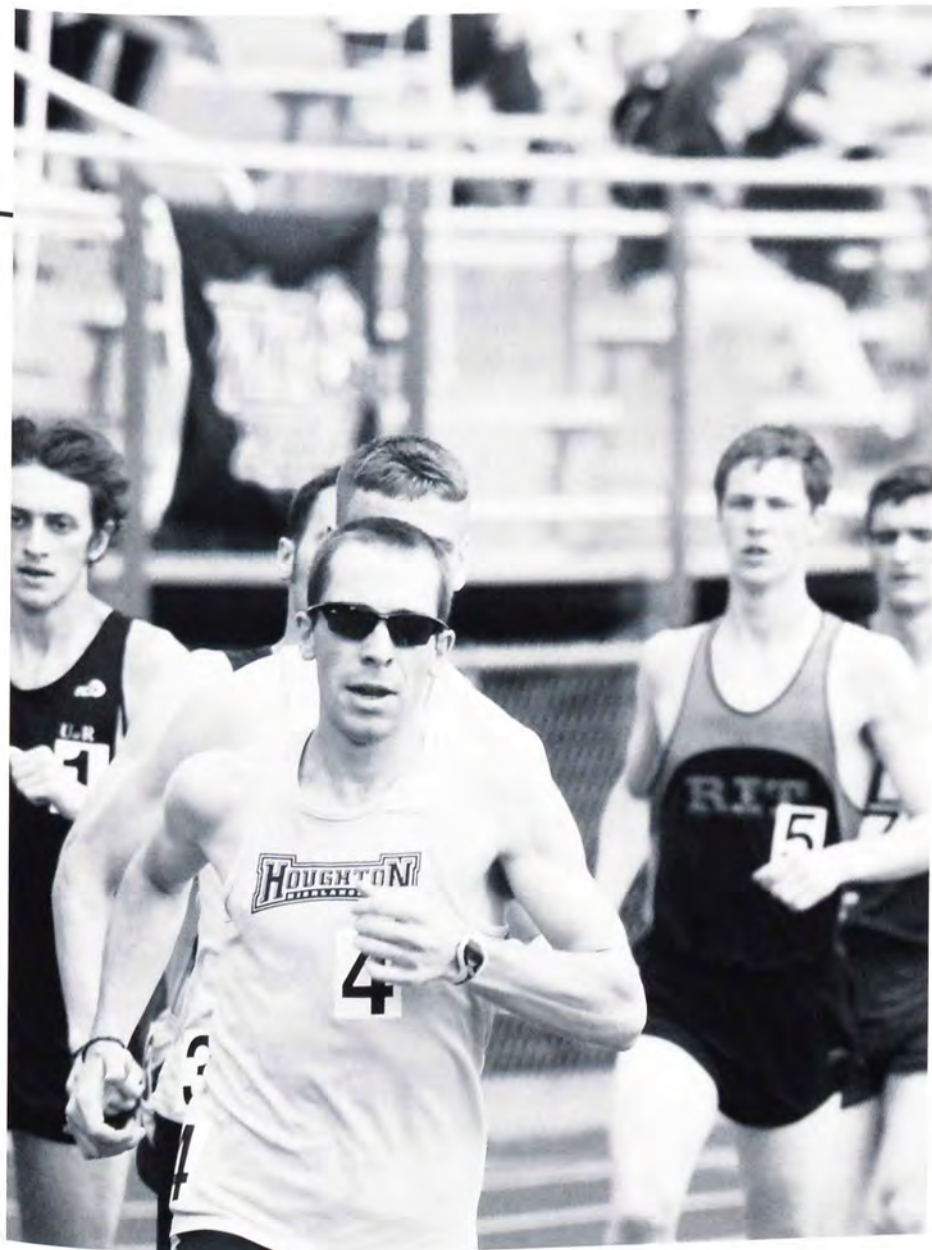
During the 2008 track & field season, many Highlanders earned national recognition. Six Houghton athletes were named All-Americans following the indoor season: Rachel Rhodes in the 3000M Women's Race Walk, Naomi Christensen in the women's 600 M, and Johnny Kimani, Steve Scott, Josiah Snelgrove, and Dan Ballard in the men's Distance Medley Relay.

Building upon their success indoor, the Highlanders sent a school-record twelve competitors to the NAIA Outdoor Track & Field National Championship. Sophomore Kaitlin Fadden became Houghton's first National Champion by winning the women's Marathon with a time of 2:57:10. In the men's Marathon, Houghton runners Jacob Connor, Michael Platt, and Joe Campagna placed well. Rachel Rhodes achieved her second All-American recognition in the women's 3000M Race Walk by finishing fourth, while Naomi Christensen and Steve Scott advanced to the semifinals of the women's 400M

and men's 400M Hurdles, respectively. Zach Adams, Johnny Kimani, Jesse McConnell, Landry Jarvis, and Dan Ballard also competed in Nationals.

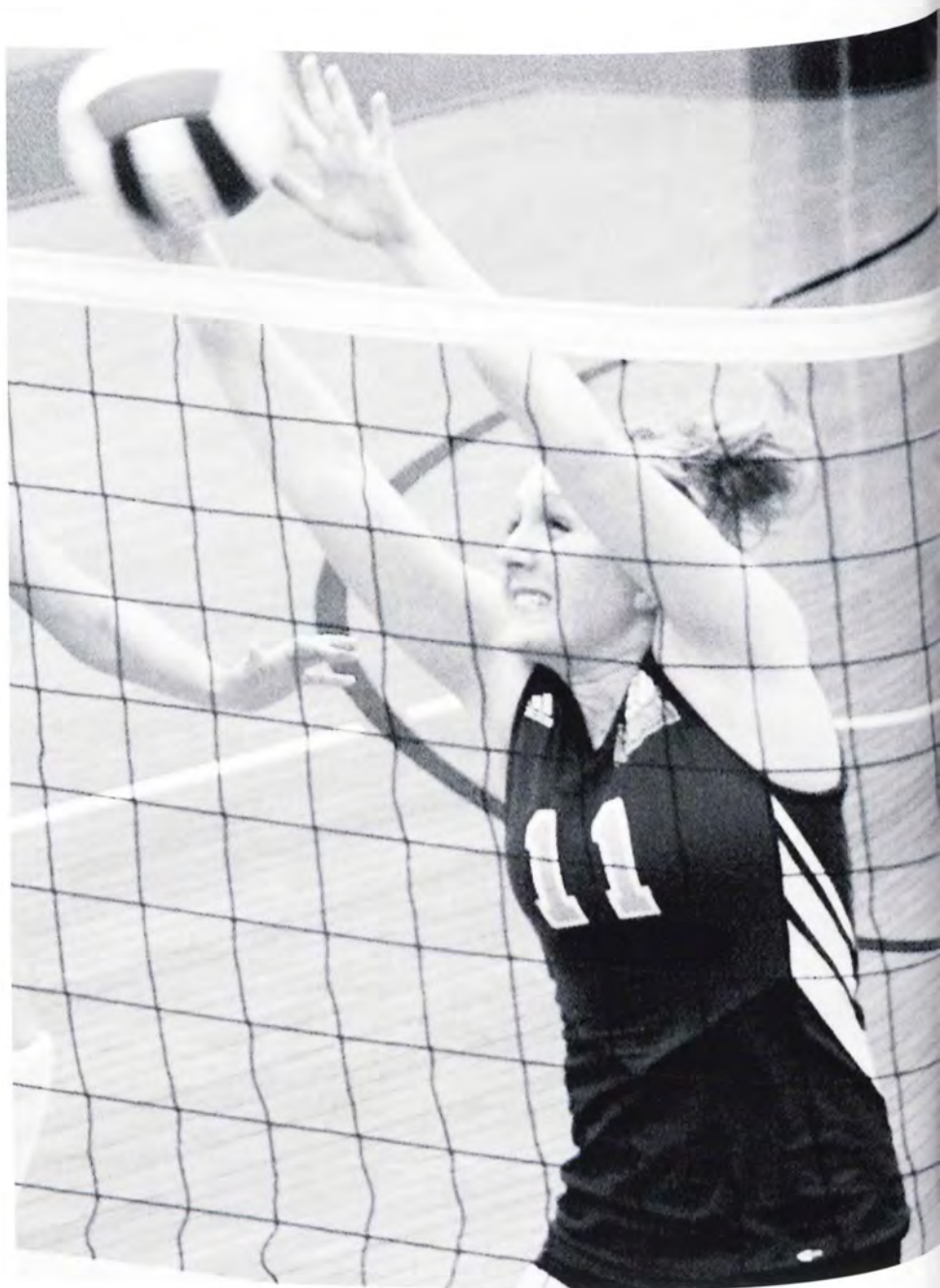

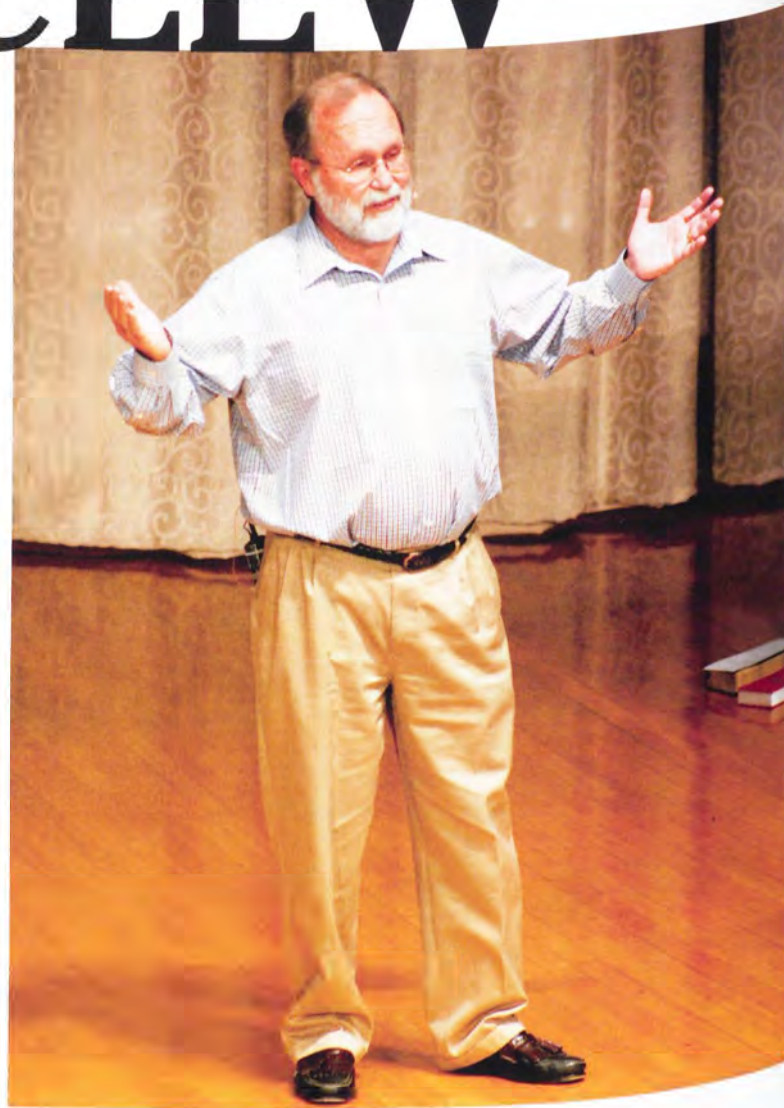
Fall CLEW

Rev. Ben Patterson

Christian Life Emphasis Week (CLEW) takes place during the first full week of classes each semester and is intended to be a time of strengthening and renewal for the Houghton community. This fall's speaker was Rev. Ben Patterson, the energetic campus pastor from Westmont College, in Santa Barbara, California. In his lecture series, entitled "A Case for Joy," he shared his thoughts on the connection between joy and gratitude. "Joy," he said, "is what you experience when you're grateful for the grace that God has given you." Over the course of the week, he expanded on his definition of joy and addressed some of the most common 'joy busters,' namely past pain, guilt, and disappointment as well as getting caught up in the details of our present circumstances.

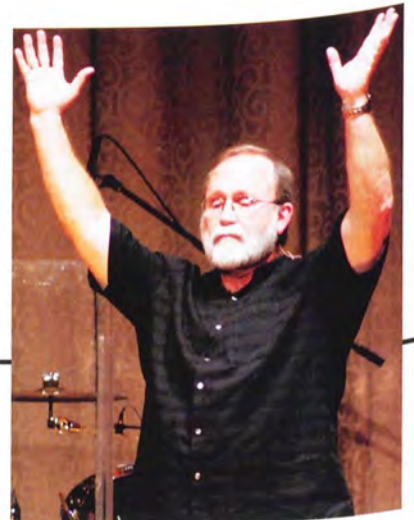
In addition to making a 'case for joy,' Rev. Patterson wove a 'case for prayer' through humorous stories, poignant narratives and a variety of pertinent scripture passages. From Luke 11, for example, Rev. Patterson reminded his audience how to pray through the familiar "Our Father," and encouraged listeners to pray boldly in light of the later, equally familiar verses of the same passage: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Throughout his sessions, Rev. Patterson emphasized both individual and corporate prayer as necessary disciplines in the Christian life.

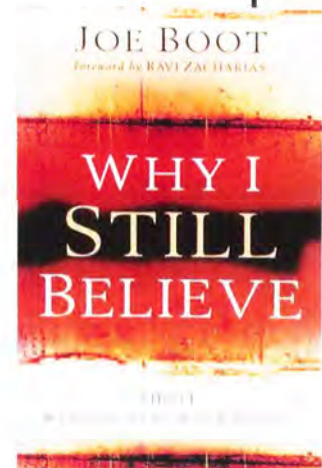
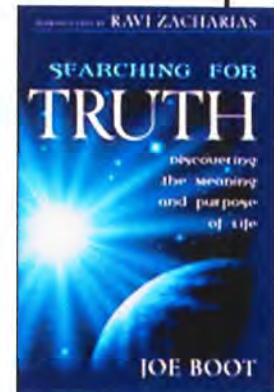
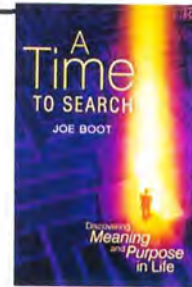
Many people, both students and faculty, found Rev. Patterson's emphases on joy and prayer refreshing, encouraging, and applicable. It was very edifying to hear someone discuss what joy is and what prevents us from experiencing it, as well as challenging to remember how



important prayer is to the Christian life. Rev. Patterson's insights prompted plenty of discussion following the week as those who attended his lectures considered how best to put what they had learned into practice.

For this spring's Christian Life Emphasis Week, Houghton College welcomed Joe Boot, Executive Director of Ravi Zacharias International Ministries, as the speaker. In the morning lectures, Boot expounded upon the gospel and its call to Christians to defend the Christian faith in the modern world. In the evenings, he focused on cultural claims made against Christianity by prominent figures who reject the Christian faith. Rev. Boot's main intent was to explain the practical application of apologetics in the individual lives of modern Christians. Boot argued that Christianity is not a "hobby" as understood by some, nor therapy, but a worldview able to confront the real existence of evil. Identifying Jesus as the centerpiece of Christianity, Boot explained how cultural trends of the west attempt to place Christ in an accepted schema, resulting in meaninglessness for Christianity. Rather than give in to such blending of beliefs, Boot challenged his audience to leave behind childish Christianity. Throughout his lectures, Reverend Boot raised tough questions and provided thought-provoking answers that left the campus pondering.

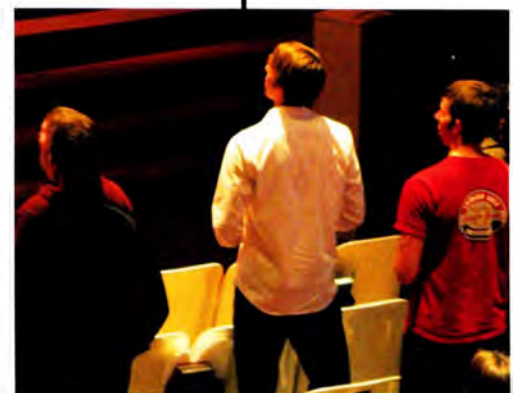

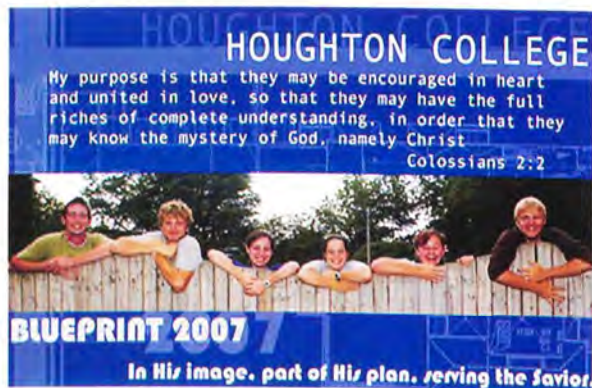

World AIDS Day



World AIDS Day was established in 1988 by the World Health Organization and is observed each December 1 to raise awareness of HIV/AIDS worldwide. This year, several members from Nehemiah's Restoration, headed up by Suzy Derksen, formed a World AIDS Day Committee to share a specific vision with their fellow students over the course of a week. Their focus was on HIV/AIDS in our own community, hoping to change the idea that AIDS is "Africa's problem." Their ad campaign "AIDS is a face...closer than you think" highlighted the desire to think locally. Global Christian Fellowship showed the film *Miss HIV*, which looks at conflicting international policies on HIV/AIDS while following the journey of two HIV-positive women in Botswana. Chapel guests from AIDS Family Services in Buffalo shared about the prevalence of HIV/AIDS in Western New York and the services that can be provided to those affected by AIDS. One of these guests is HIV positive and shared about her struggles because of the disease, and the stigma that she faces daily. Her husband encouraged us to show love in response to those who have HIV/AIDS. During chapel, 2,000 red crosses were planted in the quad to represent the number of deaths HIV/AIDS had caused since 5 a.m. that morning. A later snow left the crosses in bright relief against the snow, reminding students of the 1 million Americans and 33.2 million people worldwide living with HIV.

At the end of the week, a benefit concert and silent art action featuring works by Buffalo artist Andy Zipf, Professors Dave Huth, Gary Baxter, Jillian Sokso, and Ted Murphy, and junior and senior art students, raised over \$1000 for AIDS Family Services. Finally, a group of students traveled to Buffalo to work at the Buffalo City Mission, hoping in the future to contribute more to the local community to assist those affected by HIV/AIDS.

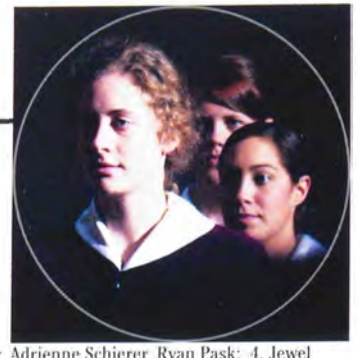

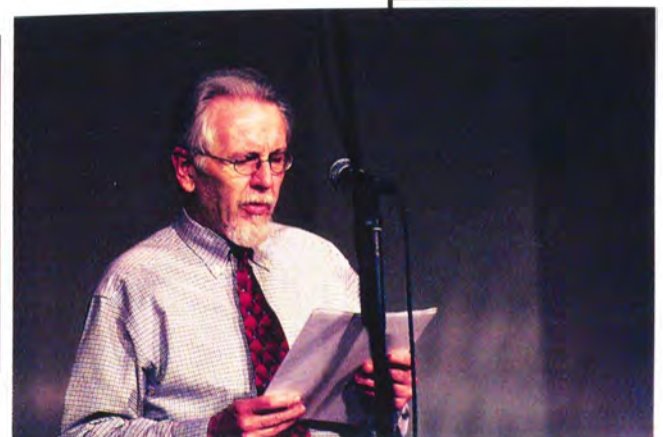

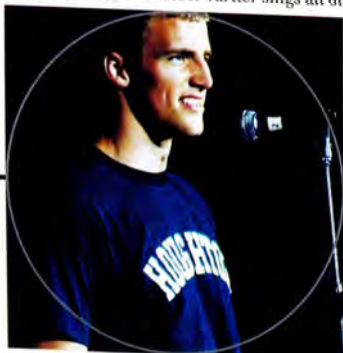

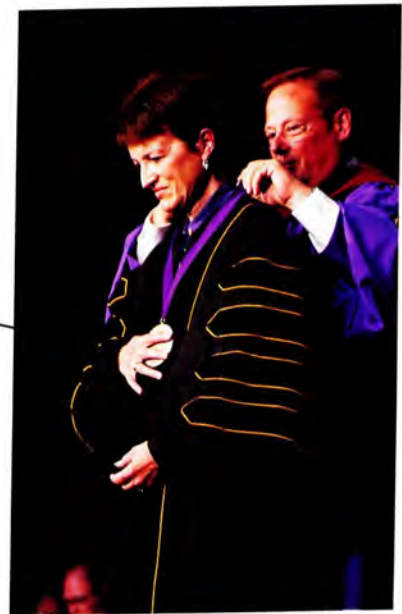

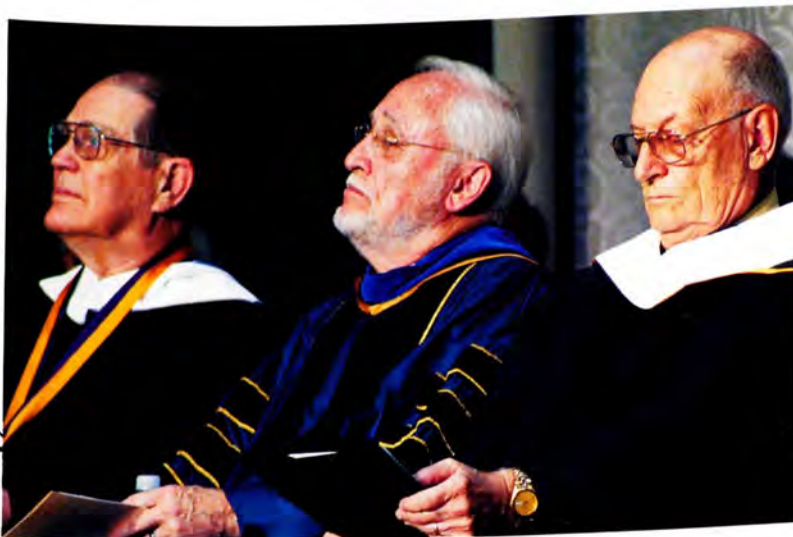

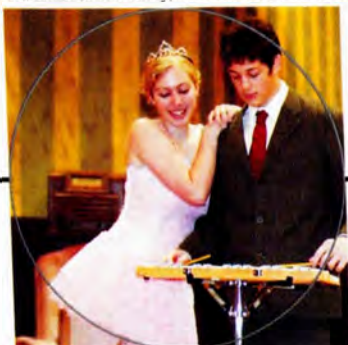

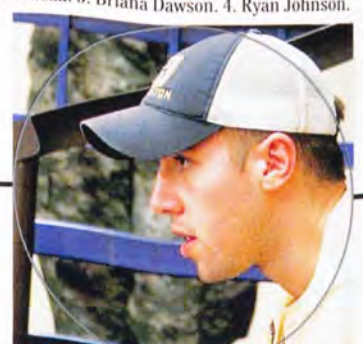

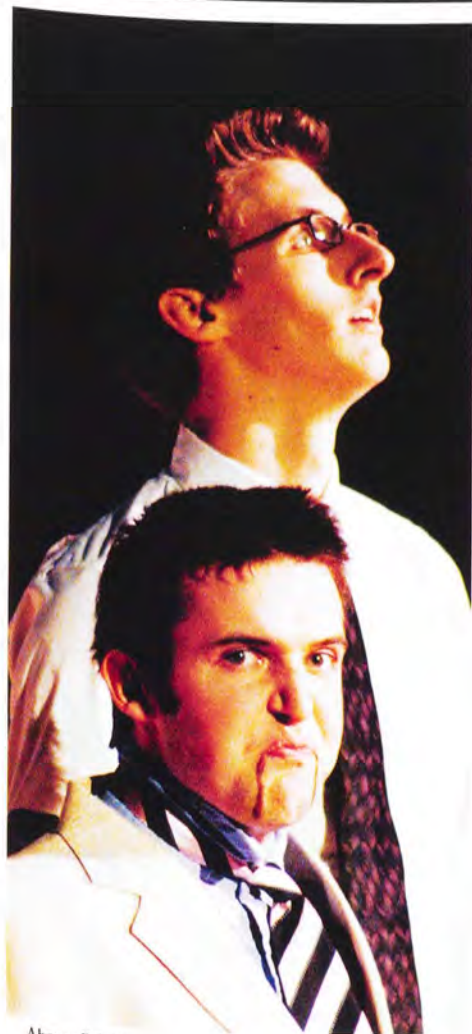

Artist Series

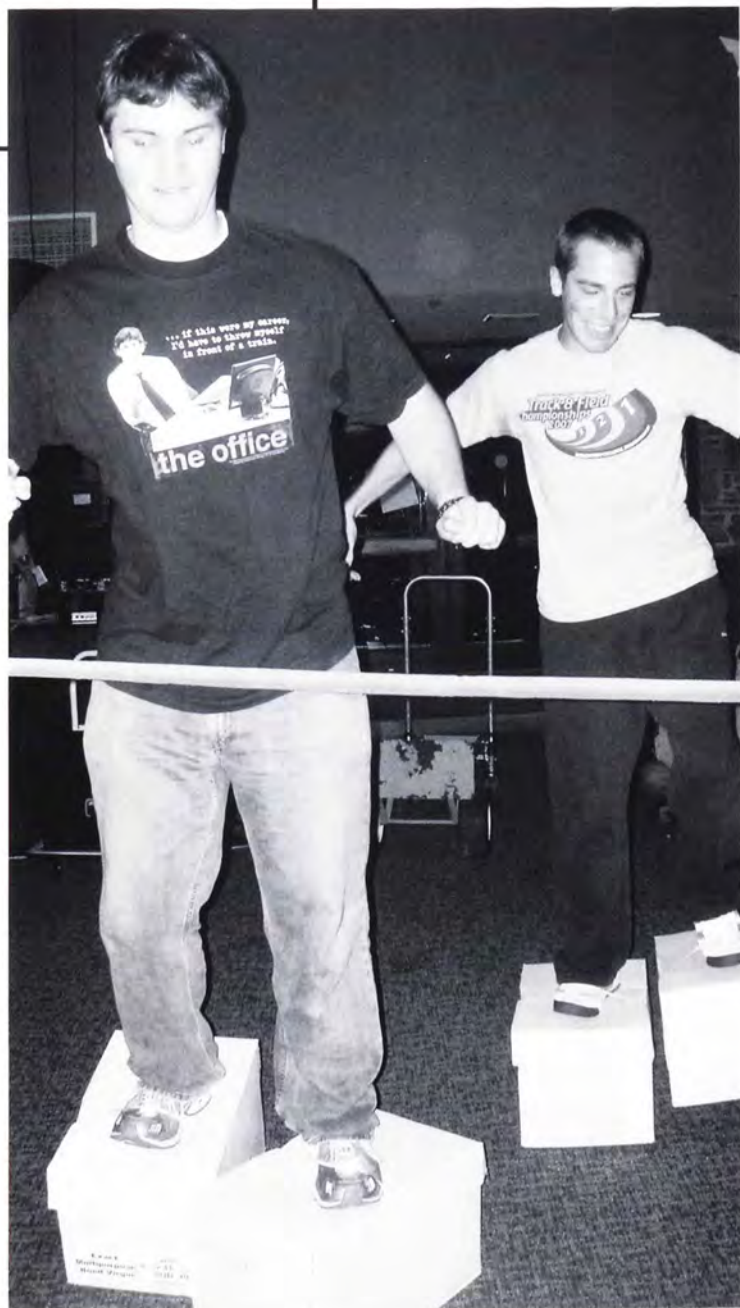
The 2007 – 2008 Houghton College Artist Series was privileged to open on October 12, with a concert by the American Brass Quintet and guest pianist/composer Billy Childs. Now in their 48th season, the ABQ, made up of Raymond Mase, trumpet, Kevin Cobb, trumpet, David Wakefield, horn, Michael Powell, trombone, and John D. Rojak, bass trombone, is the longest continuously performing brass quintet in North America. The concert featured a mixture of late Renaissance/early Baroque works, including a brass arrangement of three madrigals by Claudio Monteverdi, and some comparatively new 20th century works. Grammy award-winning artist Billy Childs also performed, both as a soloist and with the quintet. His newly-composed *Two Elements*, which was commissioned by the ABQ, was on the evening's program and was very well-received.

The second Artist Series concert also served as the inaugural concert of the Adams Piano Series. World-renowned pianist Ann Schien was featured in a unique all-Chopin program. Ms. Schien has performed in over 50 countries across the globe, and has appeared with major orchestras including the New York Philharmonic, the London Symphony, and the BBC Symphony Orchestra. She began the night with Chopin's *Polonaise-Fantasia* in A-flat, and continued with all 24 Preludes, before ending impressively with the *Third Sonata* in B minor.

Though not originally scheduled as the last Artist Series (the final one, taking place Saturday, March 8, was to have featured the Syracuse Symphony and the Houghton College Choir, but it was cancelled due to a snow storm) the third concert was given by the Chamber Orchestra Kremlin on February 16. An all-strings orchestra, the ensemble is under the direction of Misha Rachlevsky and has been performing together since 1991. With a wide repertoire under their fingers, the orchestra had a fascinating array of pieces chosen for the program. The works included the *Prayer for Cello and String Orchestra* by Ernest Bloch and Tchaikovsky's *Serenade for Strings*. Chosen as an encore piece, the ever-popular *Flight of the Bumblebee* by Rimsky-Korsakov brought both the evening and the 2007 – 2008 Artist Series to a marvelous close.

Houghton College sponsored an historic event on Saturday, April 19, 2008. For the first time since the founding of the college in 1883, Houghton held a dance - a hoedown for the enjoyment of faculty, staff and students. The Hoedown was the first planned dance sanctioned by the school.

CAB undertook the planning of this momentous occasion. The initial response was somewhat varied; some students were excited about the dance, and some found the idea of a hoedown somewhat lacking. Senior Eric Stevenson commented, "I didn't really think that a hoedown sounded like that much fun, but when I got there, it was awesome. In line with the hoedown theme, the music featured a live bluegrass band as well as a square dance caller. Students filled the Quad Saturday night, decked out in country attire and the cowboy hats passed out earlier in the week.

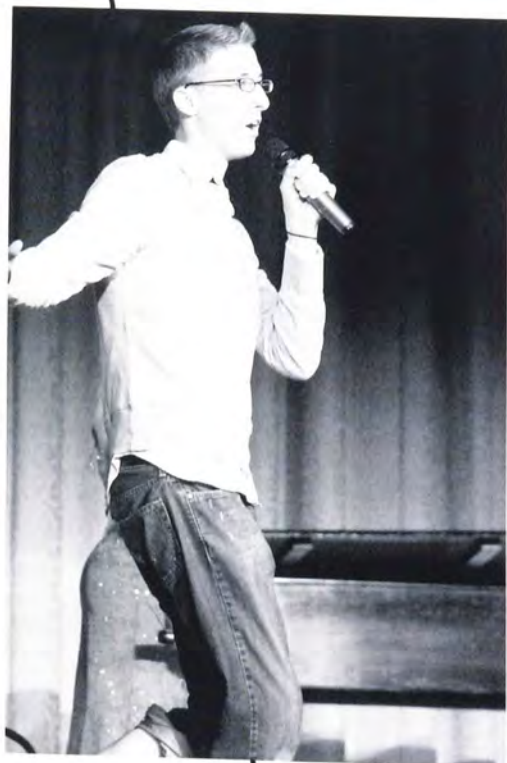

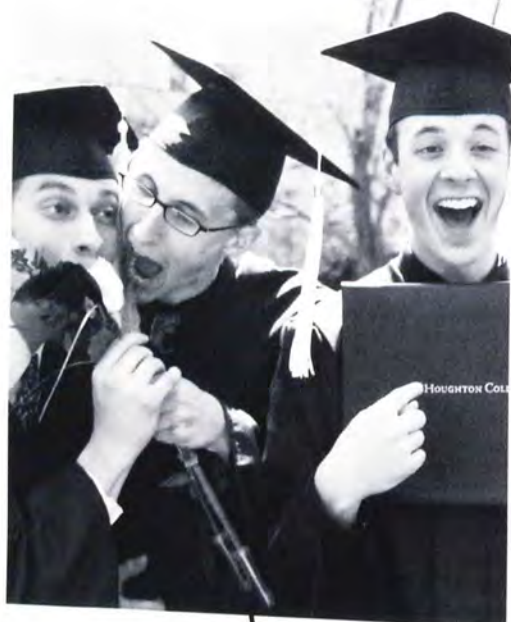

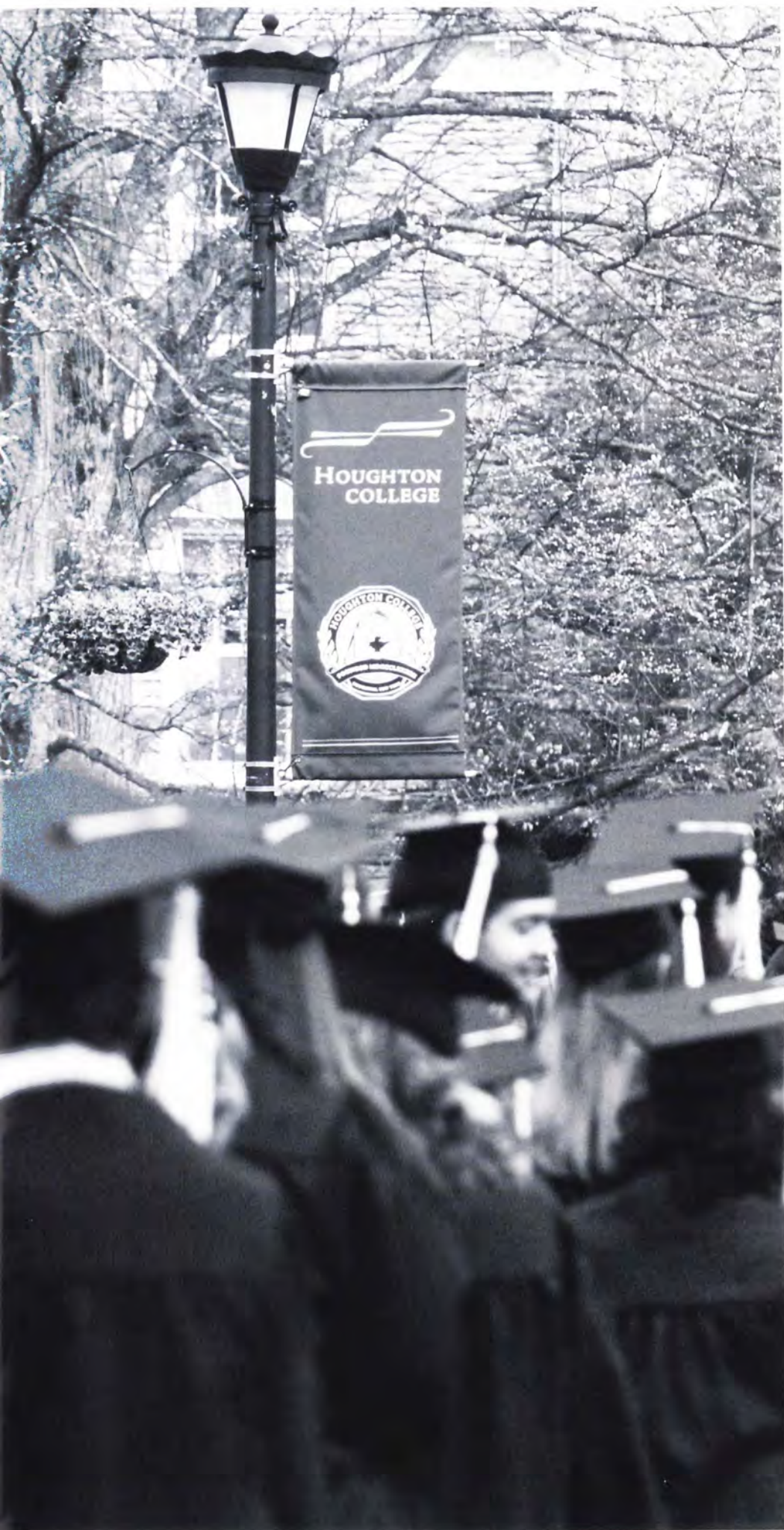
