






Graduation

- Worn outside when you're "unable to socially distance"
- · Covers your nose and mouth
- · Cleaned daily

SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Keeping six feet of separation between you and everyone else at all times (except your roommate), even if you're masked
- Social distancing isn't possible at all of our dining room tables, so:



















Remote Learning

Many remote students work from their desks daily. Students will also occasionally go to coffee shops or other locations to do their work.


One benefit of working from home is being near beloved pets. Cinnamon the cat gives support during schoolwork and classes.




Randall Student Engagement Community






After a contentious election in November 2020, Joe Biden became the 46th President of the United States in January 2021. From the Archives: Houghton and the Flu Pandemic of 1918-1920

The STAR does not report extensive spread of the flu on campus, but it still impacted the students. Of the four Houghton soldiers who died while serving in WWI—three students who left to serve without completing their degrees, and one alumnus—two never reached the front. Instead, Harry F. Meeker, Jr. and William Verne Russell died of the flu while still in training. Unlike covid, it's estimated that half of Spanish Flu's victims were between 20 and 40.

To battle with the epidemic of Spanish Influenza that has been sweeping over the Atlantic seaboard, the American Red Cross has called out Home Defense society nurses and assigned them to camps, hospitals, and building plants. Emergency orders have been sent to Red Cross divisions to secure the nurses needed to meet local problems. Several thousand contagion masks have also been released from a reserve supply at headquarters for distribution division directors.





The Influenza has not yet spent its force for it is just now coming to our borders. There is however no real cause for great anxiety as we have at present only one case. Every precaution which medical knowledge suggests is being carried out to the letter. Each student is required to be in the open a certain length of time. No unnecessary congregating is allowed, neither are students to go to the stores, post office or other public houses where the epidemic might be brought in by travelers. With these facts in mind parents should feel no alarming solicitude but rather feel that students are safer here than at home.




Dedication of the Katherine W. Lindley Center for Law and Constitutional Studies
