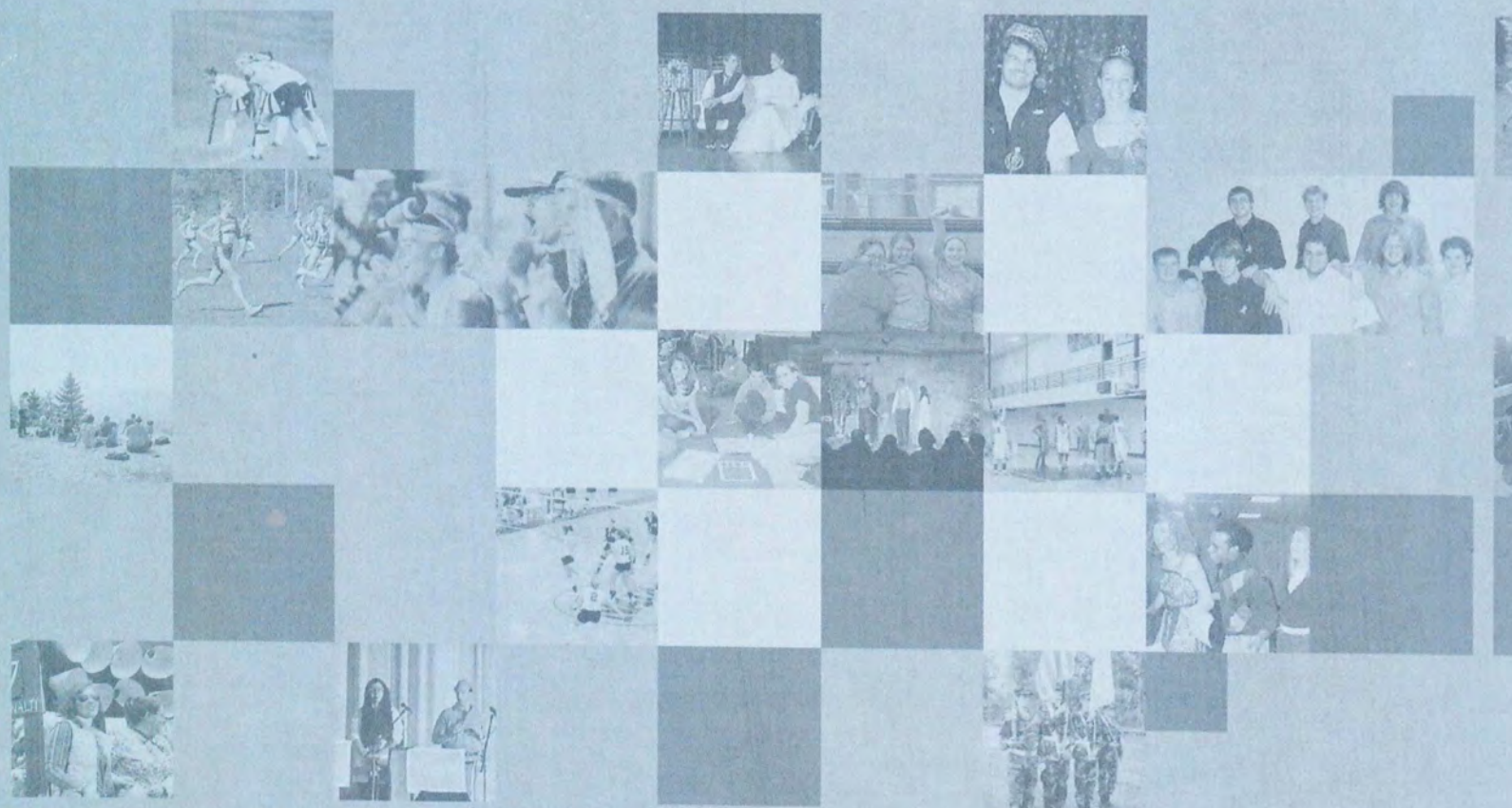


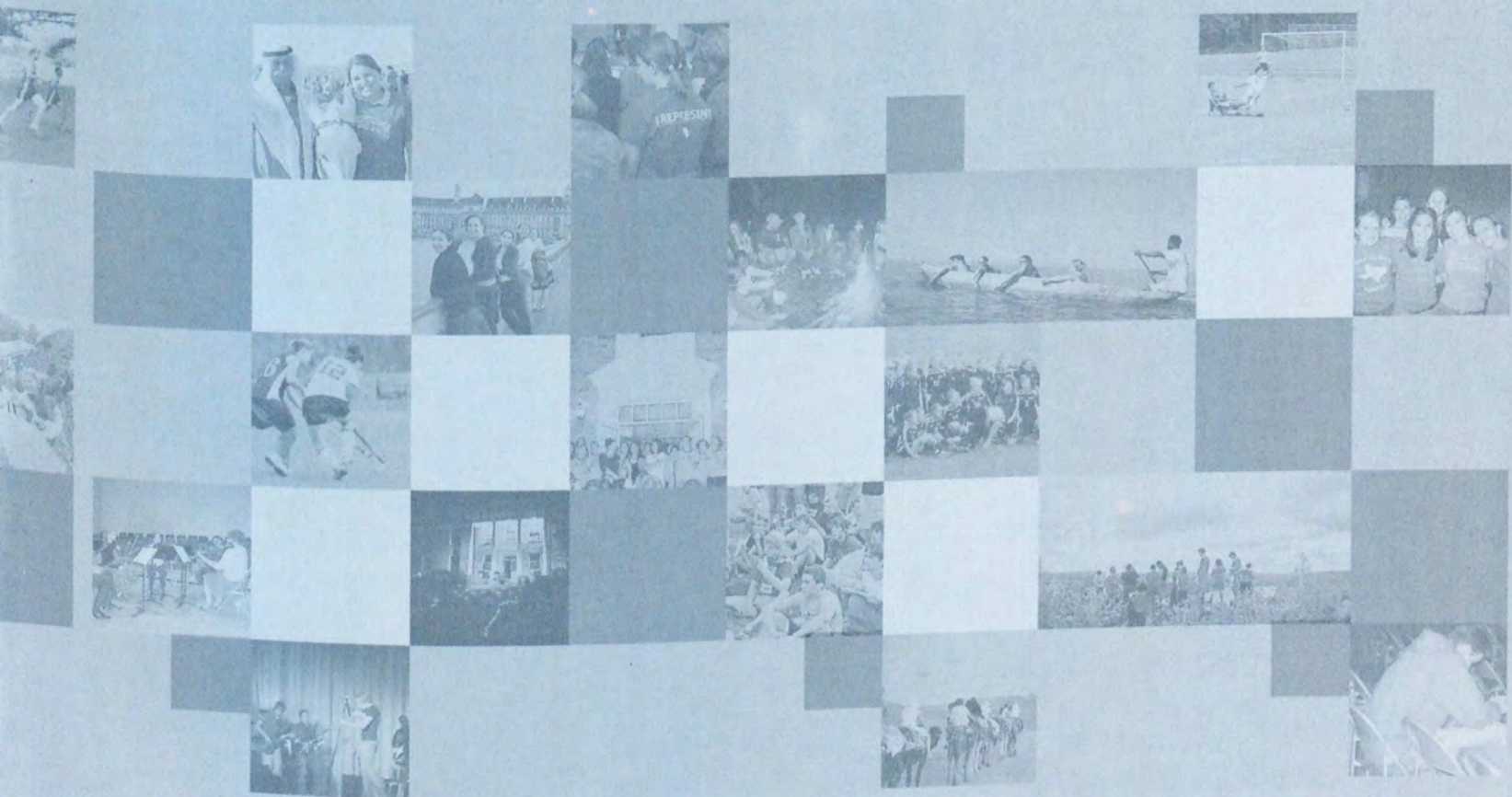

Dr. Kingdon has been at Houghton for 39 years and although he never received his high school diploma, he has earned a bachelor's degree, two master's degrees, and a doctorate. While at Houghton he has continued pastoring various churches in addition to being a full-time teacher. In his spare time he likes to build and remodel houses and travel with his wife Mary in their 34ft Airstream.

During the course of his stay at Houghton, Dr. Kingdon has served a variety of roles including being the chair of the Department of Religion and Philosophy for seven years. A tribute written to him noted that "he has faithfully served this campus, this department, and thousands of students...with a quiet sense of calling that always came through loud and clear."

Dr. Kingdon has indeed taught thousands of students over the years and he has become good friends with many of them. Students not only learn about the Bible from Dr. Kingdon, but they also have fun listening to his jokes and viewing the various cartoons he puts on the overhead. His teachings are so memorable that former student Jeff Crosby was able to answer the \$250,000 question on "Who Wants to be a Millionaire?" and credited Dr. Kingdon, as well as others, for his knowledge of the answer.

A warm smile and a friendly nature have endeared Dr. Kingdon to many people. An 8am class was always better if Dr. Kingdon was teaching just because of his obvious joy and interest. As he retires this year, the Bible department is not losing a valuable teacher but also a vital part of the Houghton Community and he will be sorely missed. In recognition of Dr. Kingdon's service to Houghton we dedicate this year's yearbook to him.

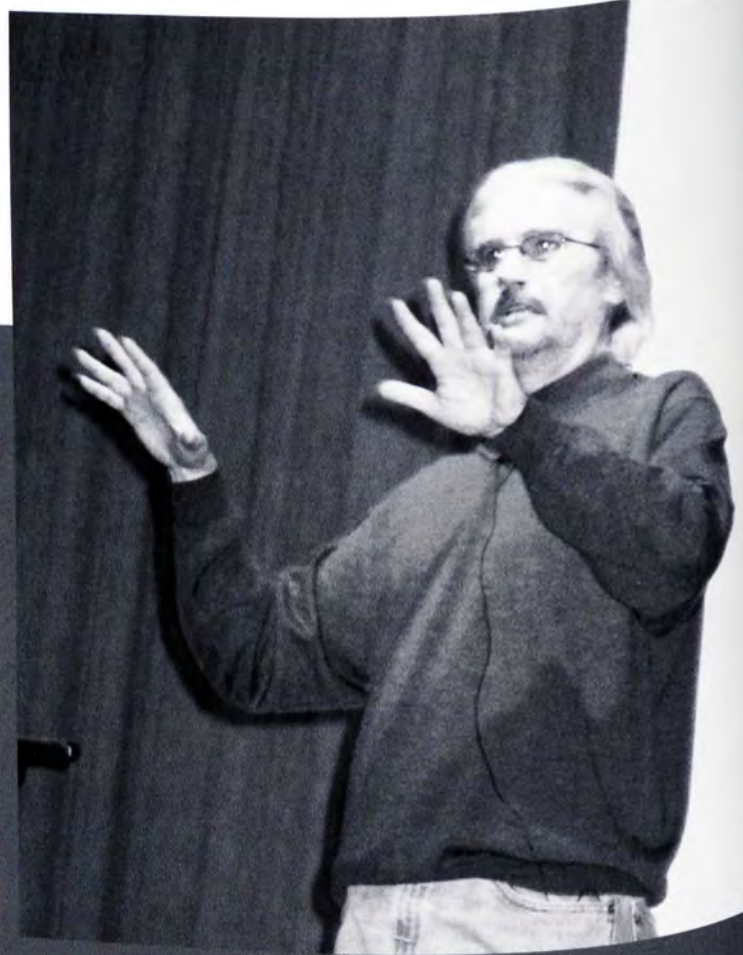
# Fall CLEW

# One Thing

# Eleuthera

In January, Coach Smalley, family, three members of his track team, and assistant coach Matthew Dougherty traveled to Eleuthera for a week to serve the people of Hatchet Bay.

The group, in cooperation with missions organization VisionQuest, worked with the five churches of the village with the majority of their time spent running an after school program – similar to Vacation Bible Schools. Close to 80 kids each day would come to hear the Bible lessons, sing songs, play games, and make crafts.

"It was a great time to hang out with the kids. Without knowing you, the kids would jump on you and give you hugs. They were all so amazing," said Dougherty. "They don't have a lot. It's an amazing physical setting, but there is a lot of poverty. Parents are typically working on the big islands, so they may be gone during the week. The kids need people to show them that they care."

A trip to the Bahamas may sound like a great vacation in January, especially for a college student living in New York, but the three student-athletes who made the trip to Hatchet Bay were not looking for a tropical island getaway.

"It takes you away from your everyday life and puts you in an environment that is different from that which you are used to," said junior Meg Radimer, who was participating in her first missions trip. "Sometimes you never know what is going to happen on missions trips and how God is going to work in your life."

Yet I looked around me and I was proud to see so many people sacrificing warmth and comfort for a noble cause. This was the scene at the Global Night Commute in downtown Rochester. On April 29th 2006, over 200 people crowded into and spent the night there to raise awareness for the Invisible Children of Uganda. I had never heard of these children, which their name would denote. But when I was told their story it broke my heart. They are forced to leave their homes at night and sleep on the cold, hard

ground. For fear of the Lord's Resistance Army who will capture them from their beds and turn them into child soldiers. So on that unusually cold night in April we slept on the cold ground to show our support for those children. We each wrote a letter to President Bush and to the New York senators appealing to them that they should help to end this long and tragic war. We made artwork, a collage of hundreds of peoples imaginative designs of the conflict they were opposing. That night we gave up our luxuries to make a stand for the children of Africa that can't stand up for themselves. We looked beyond ourselves to others who are fighting just to survive. We are doing our best to help them in that fight. And we pray that our efforts will not go unheeded.

# Service Day

Over 400 students and faculty staff spent Saturday March 18, 2006 at over 15 service sites performing various service tasks. The volunteers from Houghton cleaned, moved, worked with children, and even took children ice skating through the day. They gathered together early Saturday morning for a worship service and breakfast as preparation for the rest of the day.

Many service day teams consisted of groups of people such as a floor care team, a dorm, a club, or a sports team. The track team worked together at the Fillmore Church in Buffalo, where they stripped and re-varnished wood, painted, and installed a new ceiling. Not all groups worked doing manual labor; there was a mix of sites that included other work that focused on spending time with people.

Such a site was with the Journey's End Refugee resettlement program. The volunteers spent the day with the children of the refugees taking them roller skating, swimming and even mini putt-putt golf. Some of these children had never seen roller skates nor had any idea what to do on the skates, but nonetheless the children were ready to have fun. 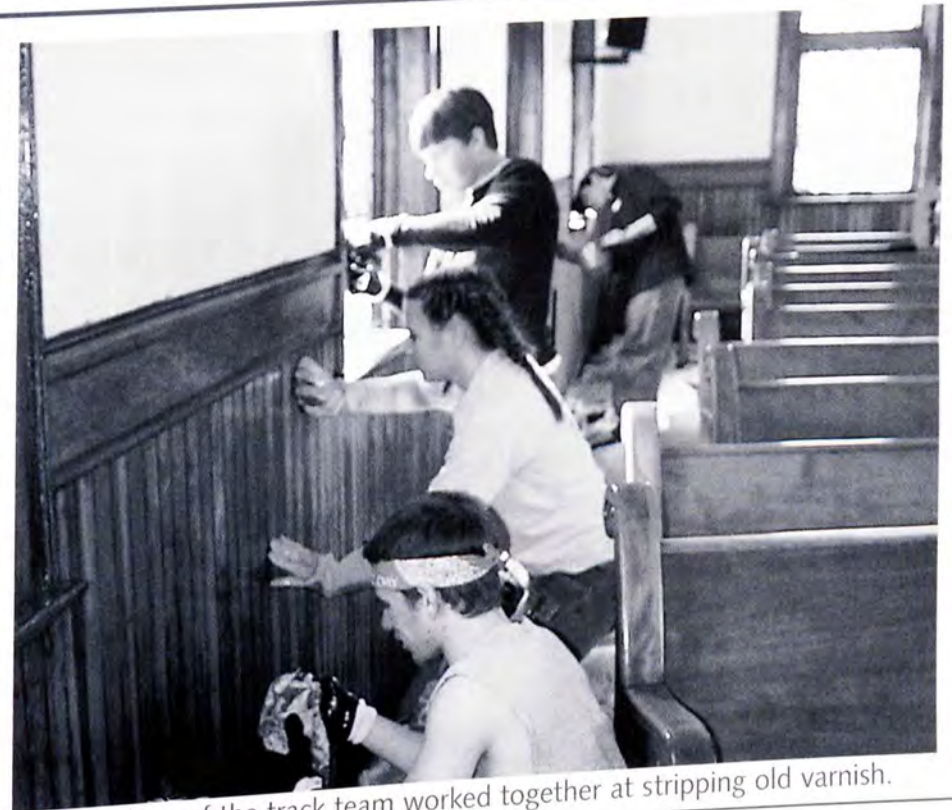

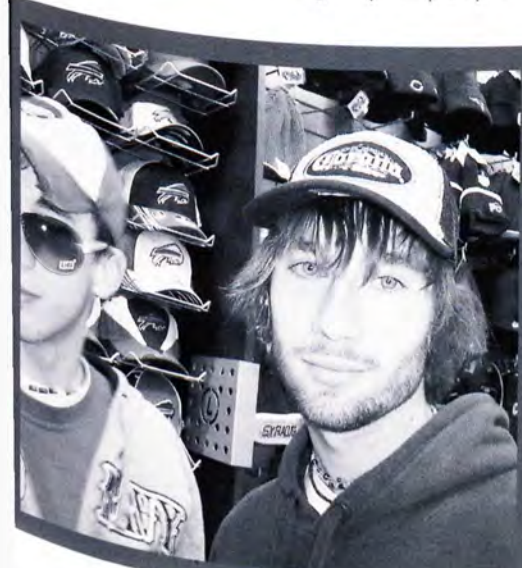

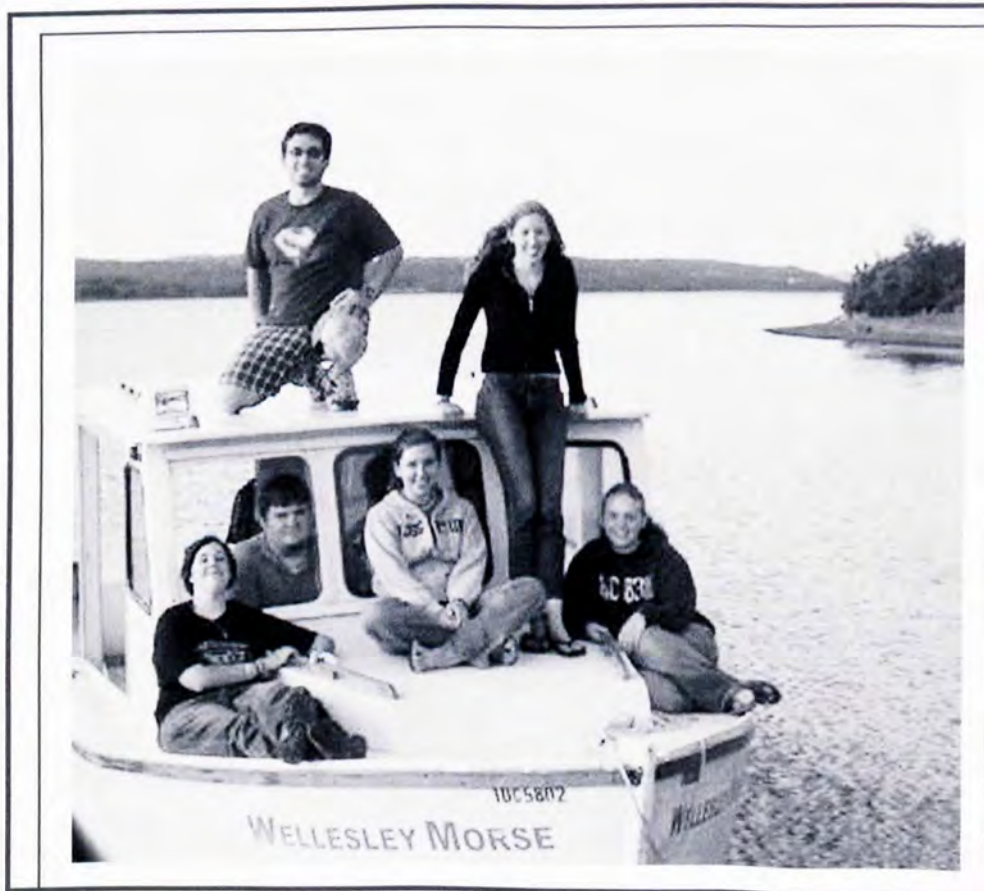

Agatha Christie builds the suspense as each person is a possible suspect. Among the most suspicious are Christopher Wren (Jason Fisher) a wannabe architect with a zany laugh and Paravicini (Jared Wright), a creepy Italian who just arrived out of the storm. To add more spice to the situation, Mrs. Boyle (Kristin Riggs) caused as much trouble as she could by demanding full services while Miss Casewell (Christine Penney) aggressively disclosed, by degrees, a mysterious past. For a bit of stability, Agatha Christie adds a refined major, Major Metcalf (Ethan Stowell) and a young impassioned police officer, Sergeant Trotter (Nick Gunning). In this chaotic mix, Mr. and Mrs. Giles Ralston (Shane Marcus and Emily Furman) attempt to serve their guests as best they can.

When the curtain closed on Mrs. Ralston running off stage to rescue her overcooked



pie, the audience hailed the actors with a thunderous applause, thanking them for an evening of suspense, laughter, and fun. None of this would have been possible without the dedicated efforts of Bruce Brenneman the director and his student director Seanna Faley.

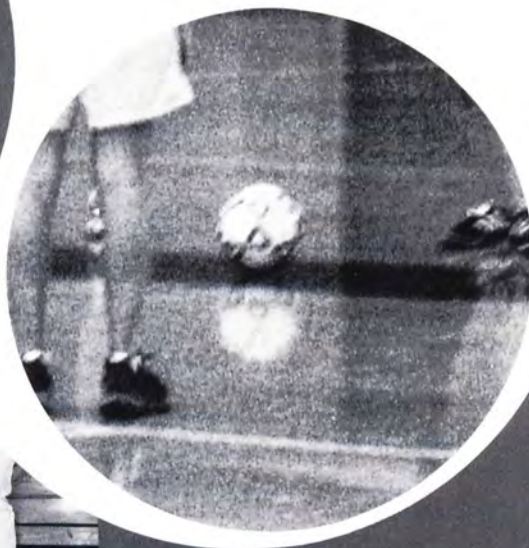

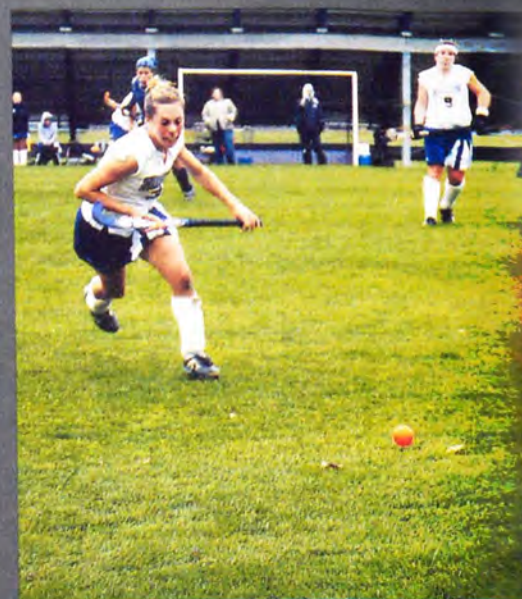
## Houghton Takes the Field for Homecoming

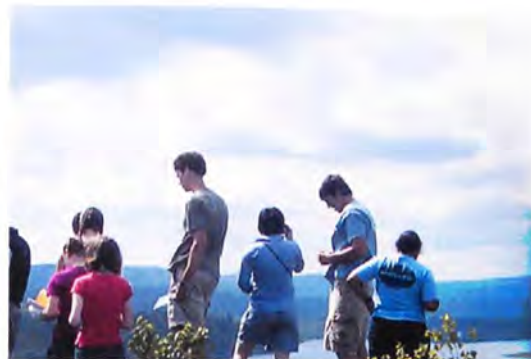

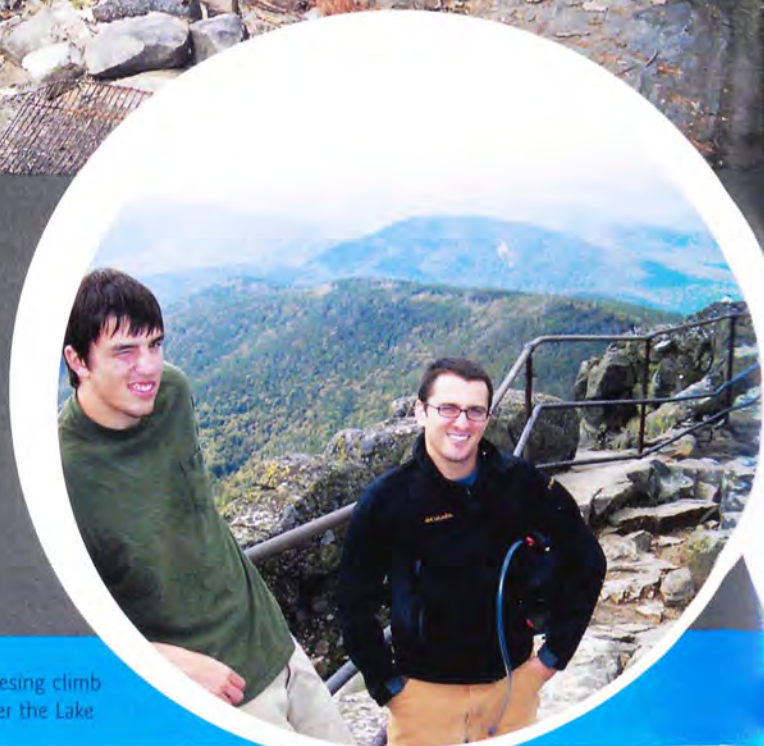

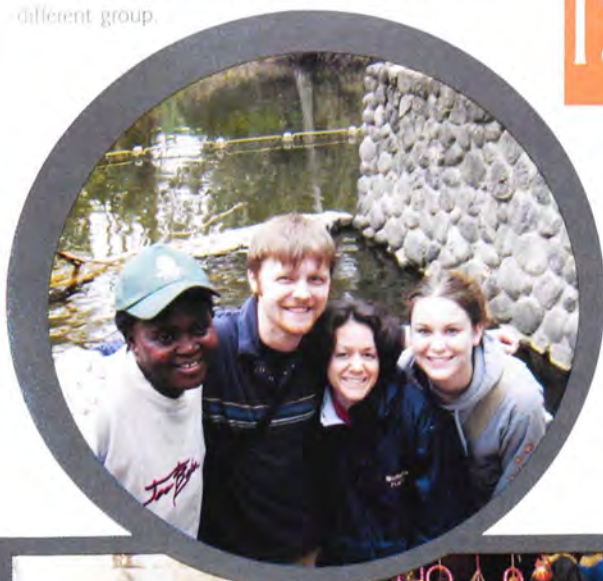

This was my journey...These are the things I will remember forever.

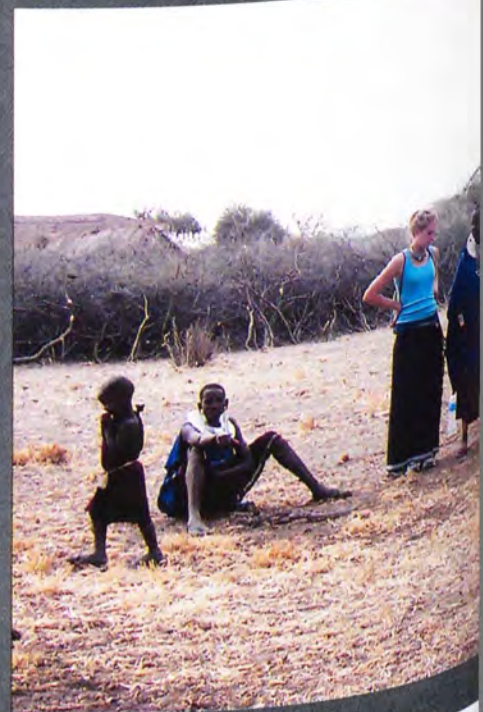

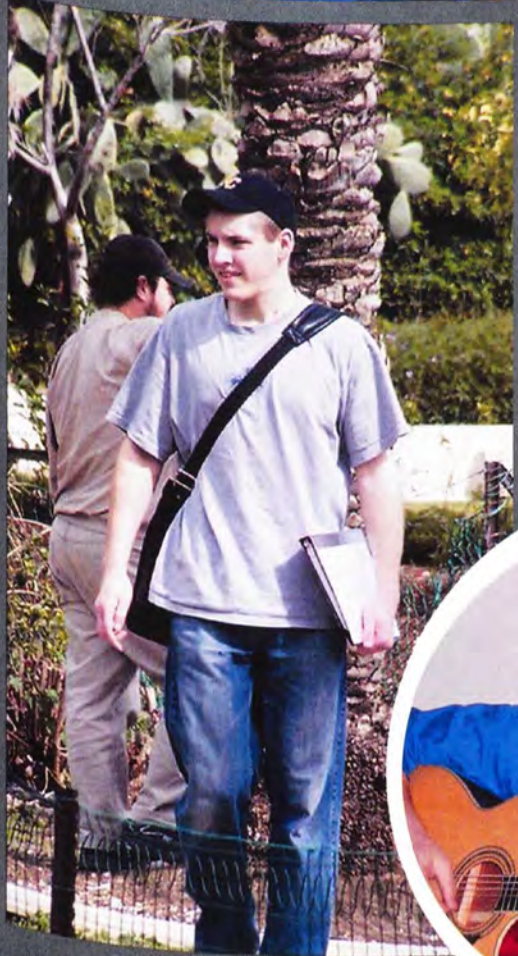

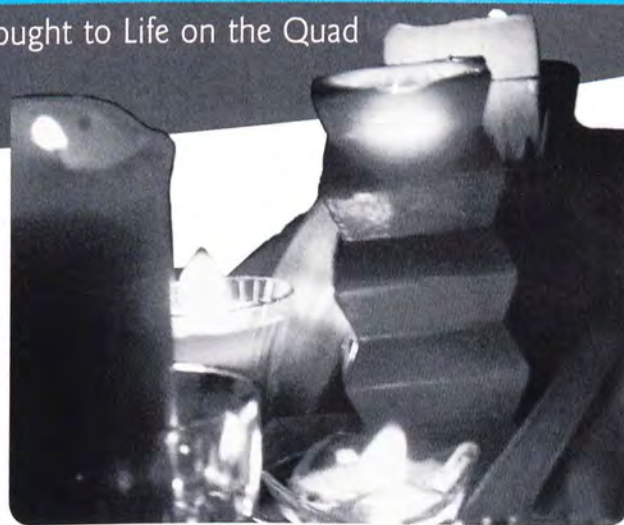

We were reminded that our time here on earth may be ended at any moment. This urgency helped the people of Gulfport open what they had left of a door to us.

A one week visit made it evident that God was winning a battle in Gulfport. The hurricane opened the door for ministry to take place. Believers were being strengthened in faith and individuals outside of it were being brought in. Many newcomers came to Little Rock and one woman openly gave her life to Christ during our stay. The needs were still great as we left the city, but God is not done with Gulfport. We had the privilege of witnessing and participating in bringing hope to the many whose homes and lives had been destroyed by hurricane Katrina.

We can never lose sight of the tragedy that this disease has wrought. Never should we forget the millions of people who suffer, and we should do what we can to ease that suffering.

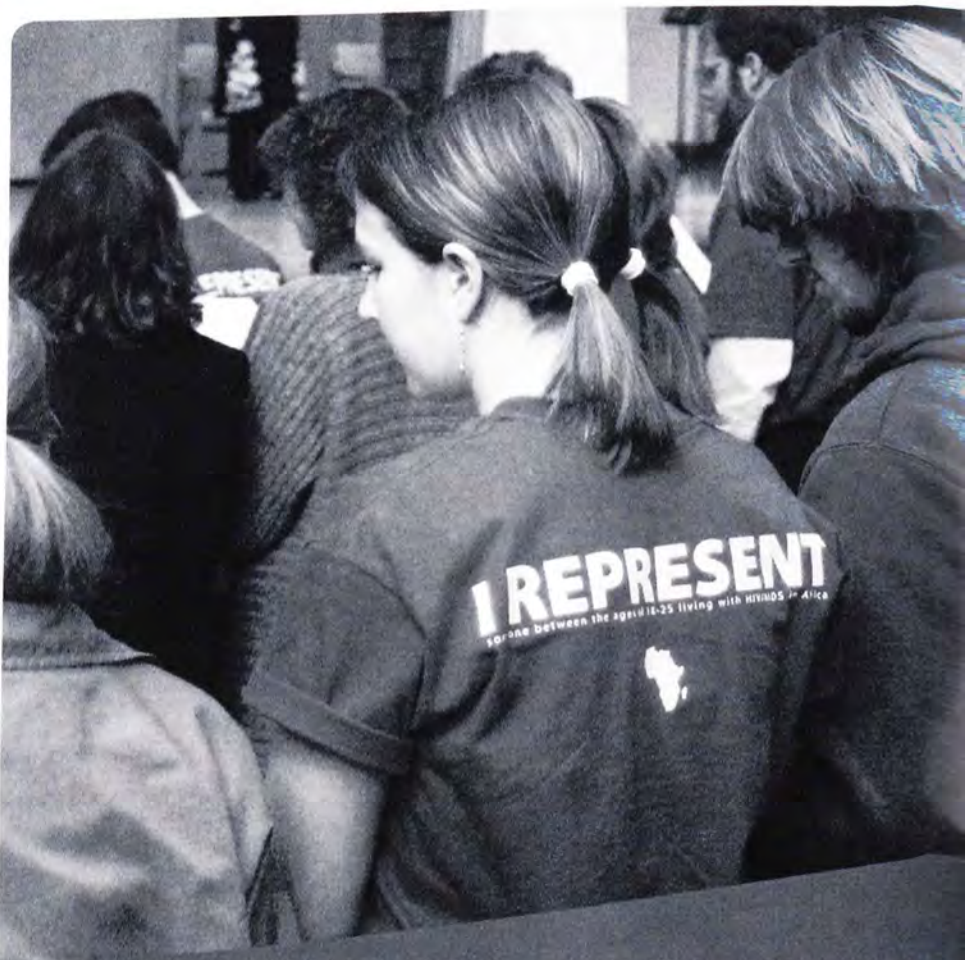

Life with AIDS is one of the struggles that millions of people around the world face. This crippling disease is spreading like wildfire in places such as Africa. World Hope International participates in a HIV/AIDS awareness week and this year Houghton joined them. Seminars were held to educate students, faculty and staff and community members about AIDS and the need for some kind of intervention. One of the visual aspects of this week was the t-shirt campaign, which students, faculty and staff participated in. In this representation, one-fourth of the community wore "I REPRESENT" t-shirts that symbolized the 18-25 population who lives with AIDS. 10% of this group wore brown t-shirts which represented those who were receiving anti-retroviral drugs. This week was a truly eye opening experience and many people gained a greater appreciation of the AIDS crisis and how they can help change the situation.

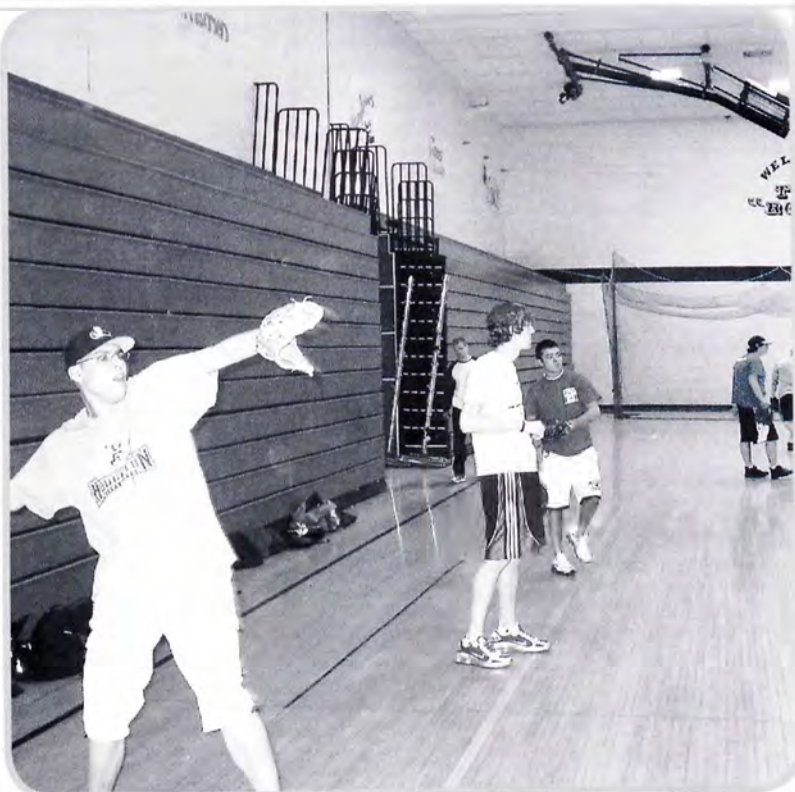

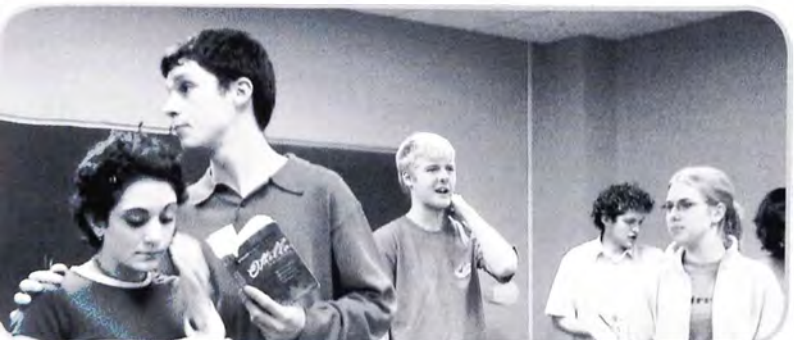

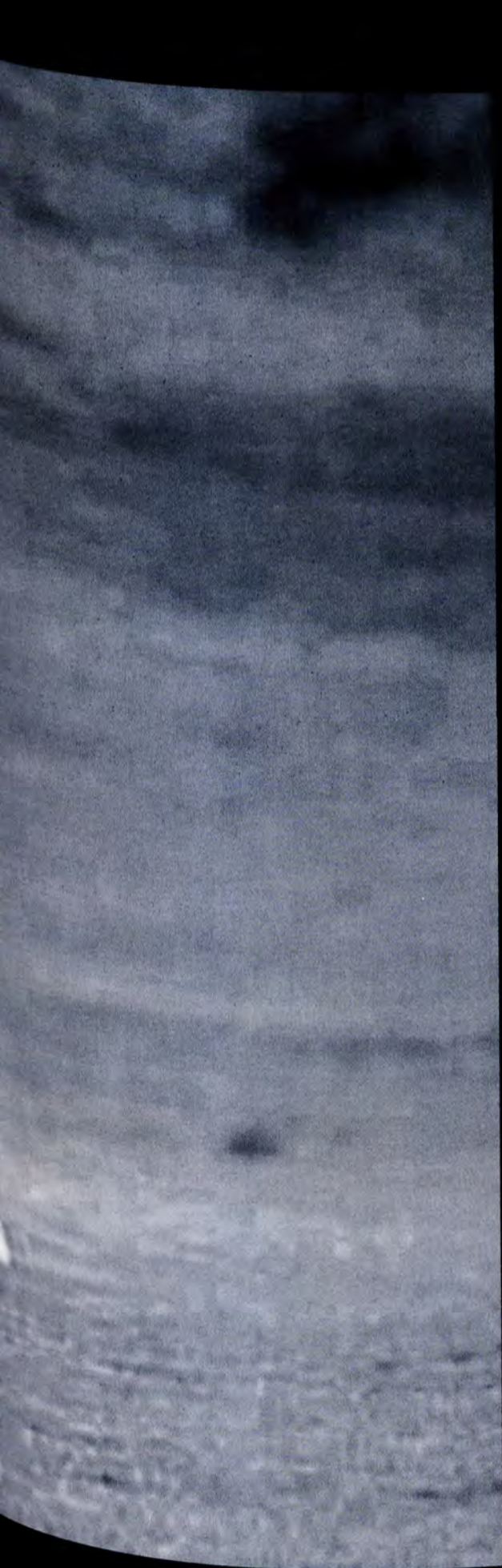

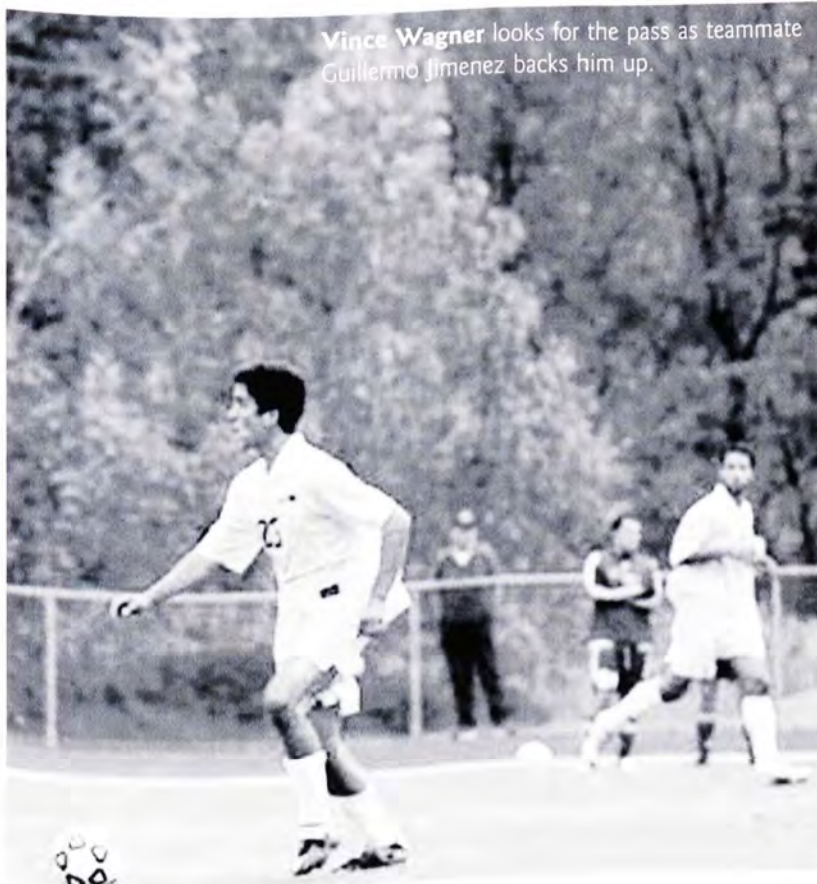

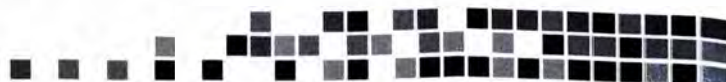

## All-Star Running

The Houghton College Track teams enjoyed one of their most successful seasons in the history of the program in 2006. Although the track season cannot be measured in wins and losses, improvements across the board could be seen in the program. During the indoor season nine school records were broken, six athletes qualified for the Indoor National Championships. Including Mary Gibson, Rachel Rhodes, Sarah Whipple, Joe Mason, Ryan Fadden and Nick Ruiz. Mary Gibson garnered two All-American awards in the mile, and one thousand meters races finishing fifth in both races. The outdoor season continued the impressive performances with twelve school records being broken, and three athletes qualifying for the Outdoor National Championships before the season ended. Both the men's and women's teams finished the season at the Con-

ference Championship meet with both teams placing the highest ever in the conference championships with the women finishing sixth, and the men finishing in 8th place. Evidence of the strong performance at the conference meet can be seen in the twenty seven personal bests set during the meet as well as six school records being set. Mary Gibson again garnered a prestigious award, being awarded the AL Turner Female Athlete of the meet at the conference championships for dominating wins in both the women's 1500 meters and 800 meter races. The 2006 track season saw the continued growth and overall improvement of the Houghton Track program and next year looks to continue the growth as Houghton Track continues to move up the rankings in the conference.

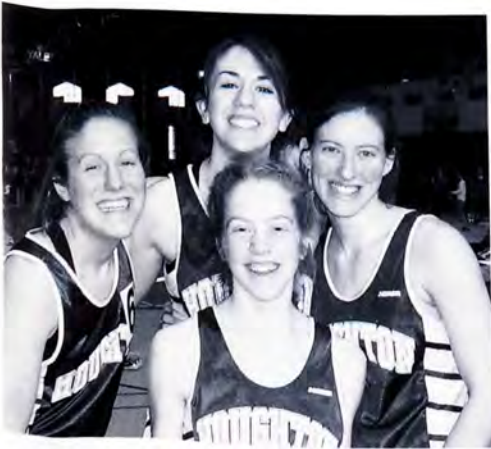

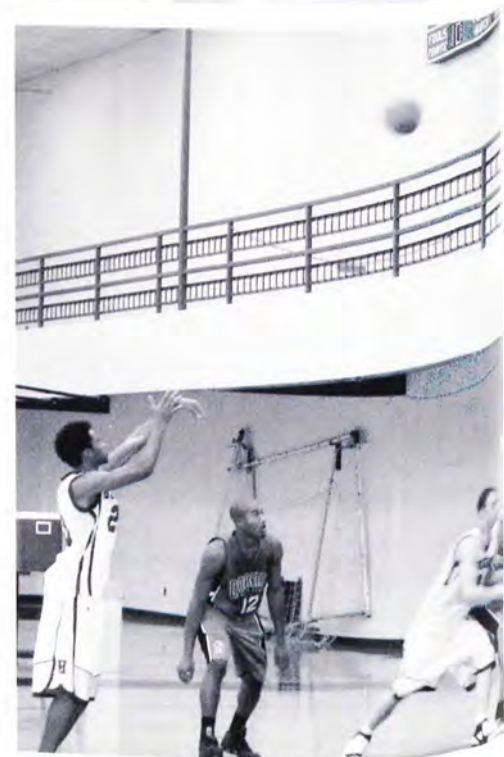

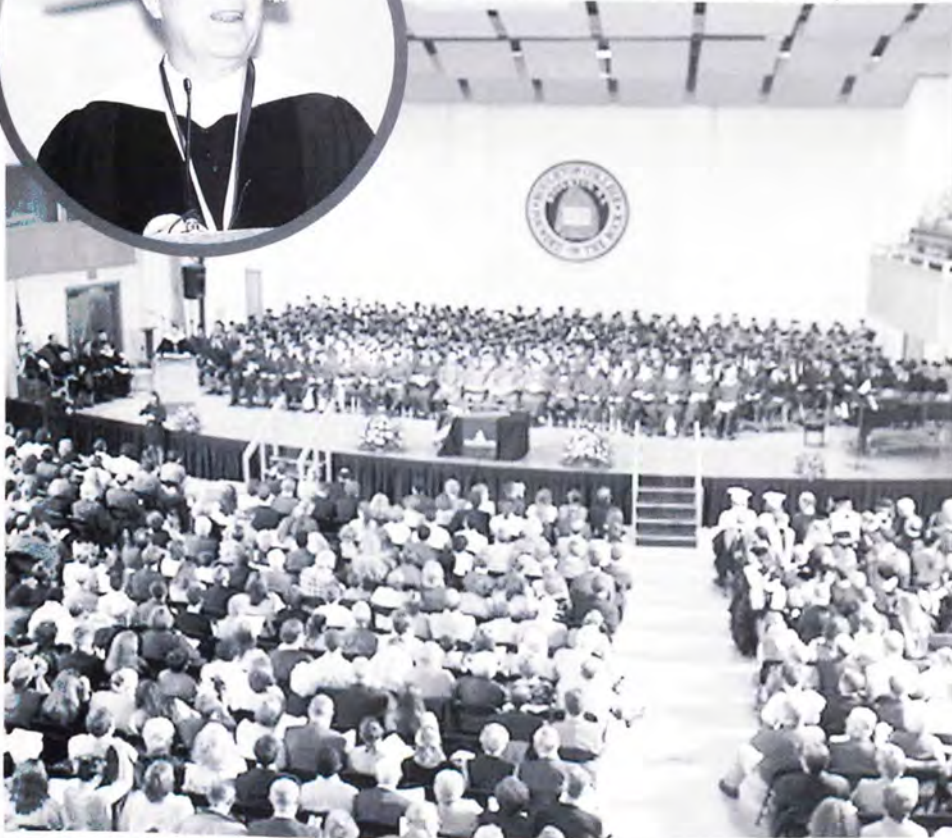
