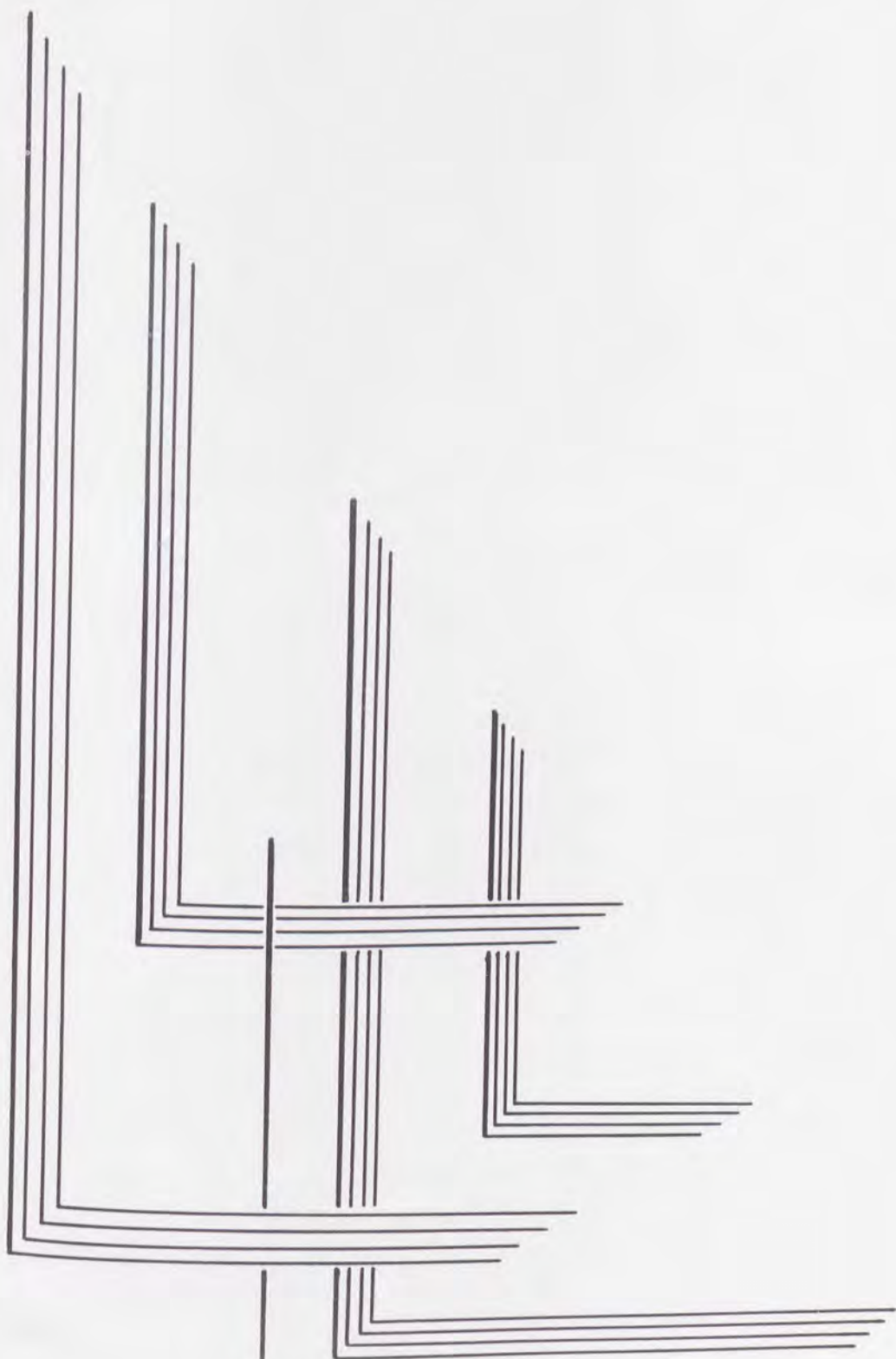

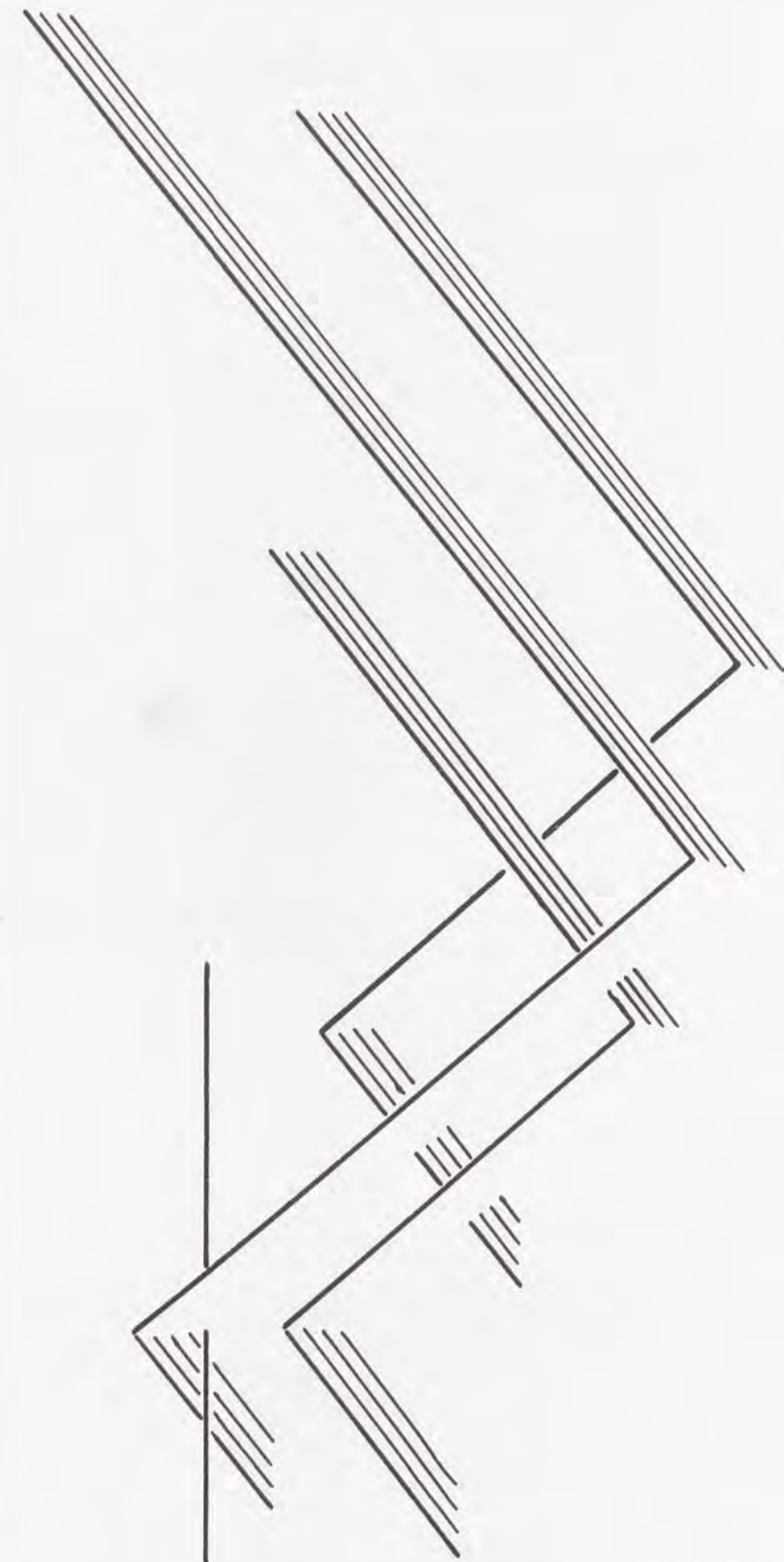

For the second successive season the Gladiators, coming from behind by two games to win three in a row, triumphed over the Pharoahs.

The opening game was a brilliant defensive battle waged mainly between 40-yard lines. Paul Titus gained 107 out of 134 yards in the losing cause for Gold. The only score came in the last quarter when Val Dunham snagged a pass on the Gold 13 and streaked across the line, leading Purple to a 6-0 win.

Purple again emerged victorious at Homecoming. Ralph Marks picked up a fumbled punt and with the help of key blocks, sprinted 90 yards to paydirt. Bob Miller hit Wes Smith, who ran 30 yards for the second Purple touchdown. Late in the third, Gold scored on a Paul Mills pass, making the score 12-7.

The tide changed in the third contest as the Gold company got under way. On a poor snap, Purple's Ralph Marks was caught in his own end zone for a safety. Two full quarters of rugged defensive action followed. Late in the fourth, Bill Revere intercepted a Pharoah pass and raced 40 yards, making the final score 8-0.

The Gladiator offense put on wings in the fourth game, capitalizing on the arm of Paul Mills, whose pinpoint passing to his brother John accounted for two Gold touchdowns. The game ended 12-0, throwing the series into a play-off.

The season climaxed on a sub-freezing Monday night under the lights at Wellsville's Tuller field. Both teams as well as the shivering spectators were in high spirits. At half time, Purple was leading 6-0 on a pass from Bob Miller to Wes Smith. With six minutes left to play, John Mills snared a pass from his brother in the end zone to tie the score. Paul Mills hit Revere for the all-important conversion and for the 1960 championship.

Twelve players were named to the varsity squad by the coaches at the end of the season. Chosen from the Gold team were—Mac Cox, Paul Mills, Mark Oyer, Bill Revere, Norm Strum and Paul Titus. From Purple, Leo Angevine, John Bechtel, Val Dunham, Nathan Mack, Bob Miller and Wes Smith were selected.

The Academy triumphed in the Class Football League by edging out the Seniors 25-23 in the last game of the season. They captured their first game by a forfeit over the Juniors and the second by defeating the Freshmen 26-12. The second place Seniors gained only two wins, beating the Juniors 42-17, and completely humiliating the Freshmen by a score of 90-7.

The Juniors and the Freshmen both managed to drub the Sophomores by scores of 32-35 and 40-6 respectively, ending their records with one victory each. The Sophomores finished the season completely in the hole with two losses and two forfeits.

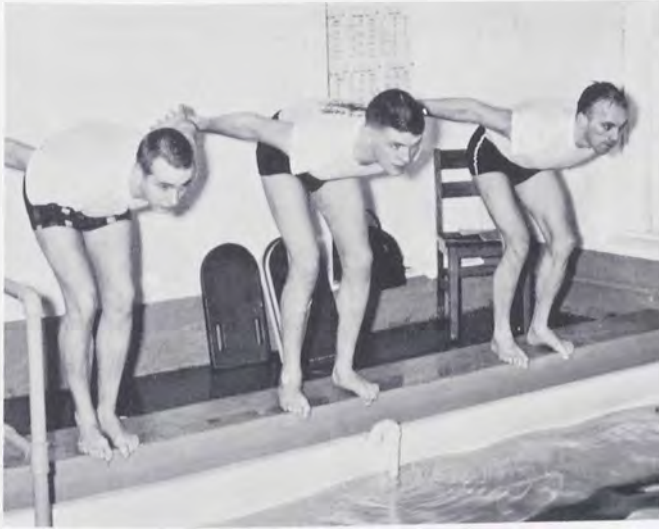

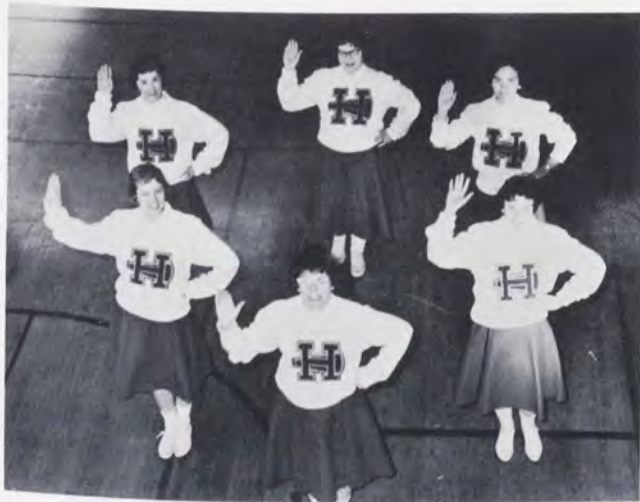

The Varsity men defeated the Alumni 54-52, and the Freshmen 57-48. The women won easily over the poorly represented Alumni team by a score of 40-23.

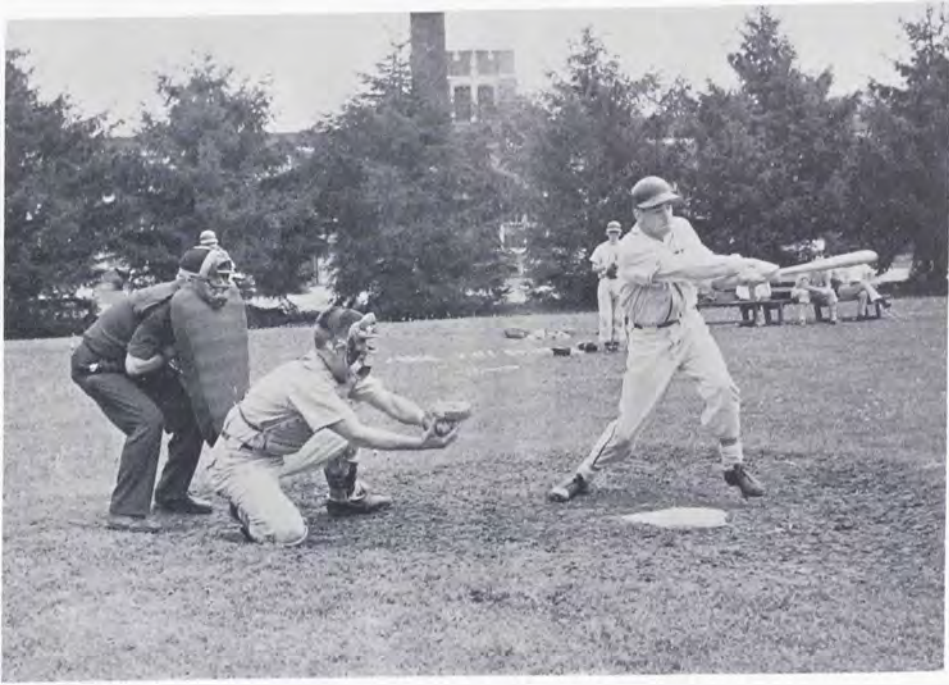

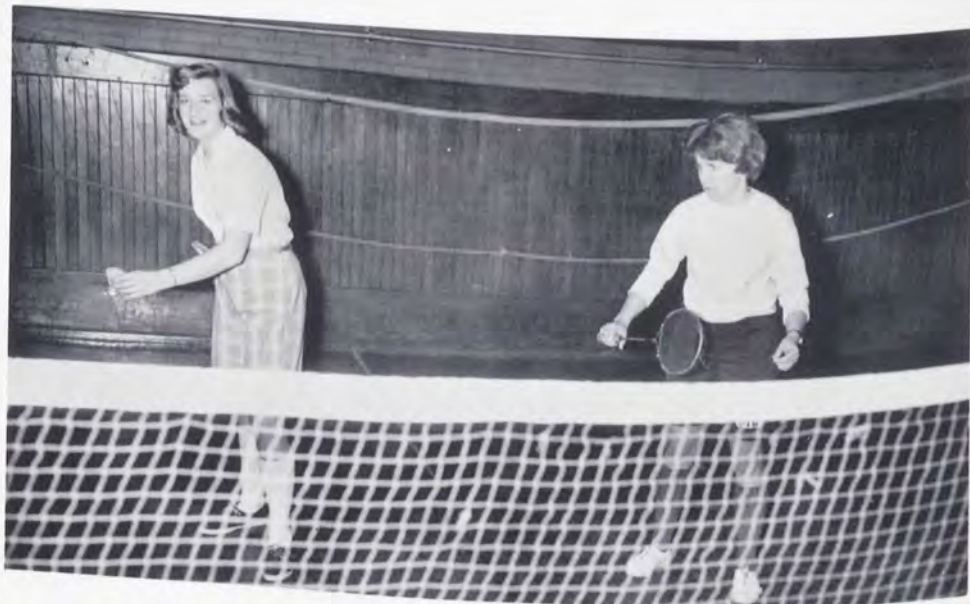

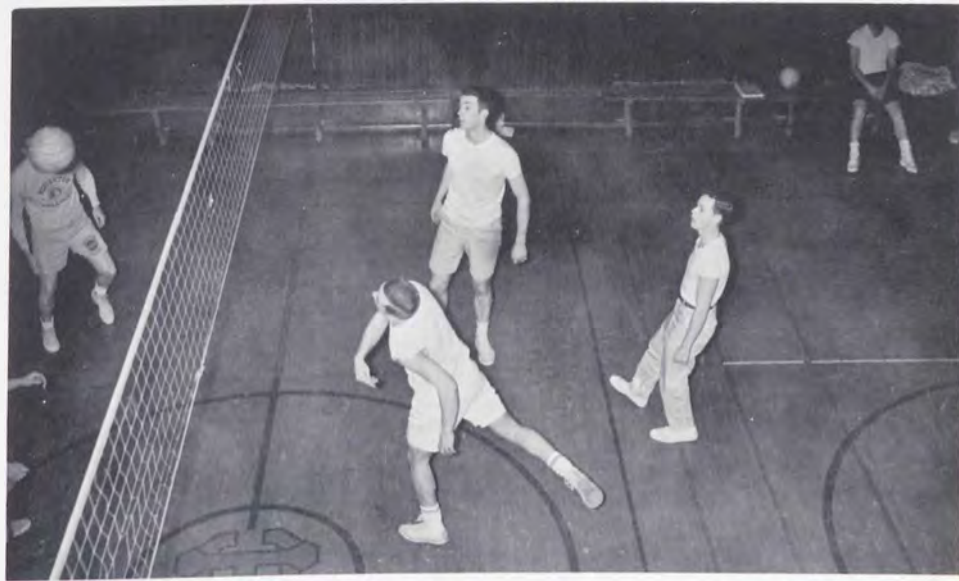

Although no records were broken in either meet, the points were well-distributed among the classes and the underclassmen interest promised continued keen competition.

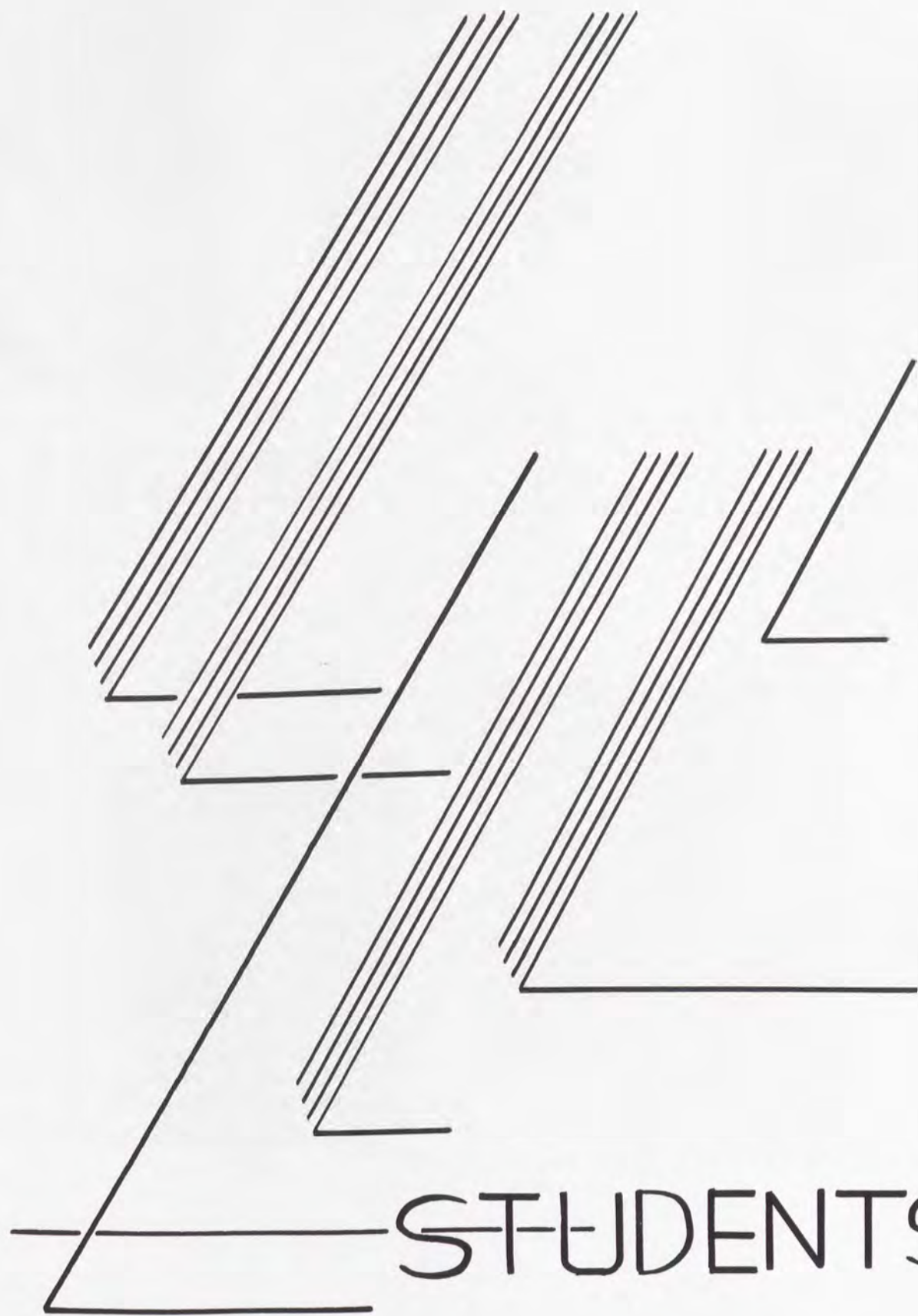
