Highlanders Win NCCAA National Championship

In spite of the graduation of last year's scoring team of Steve Burke and Rob Jacobson, the 1980 Houghton soccer team managed to post a 14-3-3 record and win the National Christian College Athletic Association Tournament for the second year in a row. Senior goalkeeper Kevin Austin and Senior sweeperback Jon Ortlip led a tight defense that, with the help of fullbacks Steve Lindahl, Scott Myers, and Bill Baker, continually frustrated opponents and allowed only 16 goals in 20 games.

Senior Peter Fuller and Juniors Brian Davidson and Doug Johnson led the offensive attack. Davidson led the team with 9 goals, while Johnson added 7 of his own and assisted in 12 more. Johnson tied the team record for single season assists and his 19 total scores was the highest for this year's team.

Other outstanding players included tough Al Bushart and the sophomore duo of Bob Chiapperino and Tim Edwards. Edwards was named to the NAIA District 31 All-Star second team. Speedy freshmen Bruce Makin and James MODOZIE added to the offensive machine, as did Peter Roman and Tim Brinkerhoff, who was chosen to the NCCAA All-Tournament team.

The Highlanders look forward to next year, with 15 returning letter winners and a host of good, young players. With Davidson in the goal, a healthy MODOZIE, and the likes of Ed Schupp, Blair Finis, Bob Wieland, and Jon Barnett vying for starting positions, the team should be a formidable one.

The women's field hockey team narrowly missed a .500 season, posting a 5-7 record instead. Although many of the girls were disappointed with the record, most of them agreed that it was not all indicative of the quality of the team.

Directed by Coach Wells and led by co-captains Gretchen Berquist and Tracy Brooks, the team fought to a fourth place in a Houghton-sponsored NCCAA invitational tournament. Tracy Brooks was awarded the sportmanship award for the tournament.

Chaplain Bareiss will certainly be missed by all of the faculty, staff, and students.

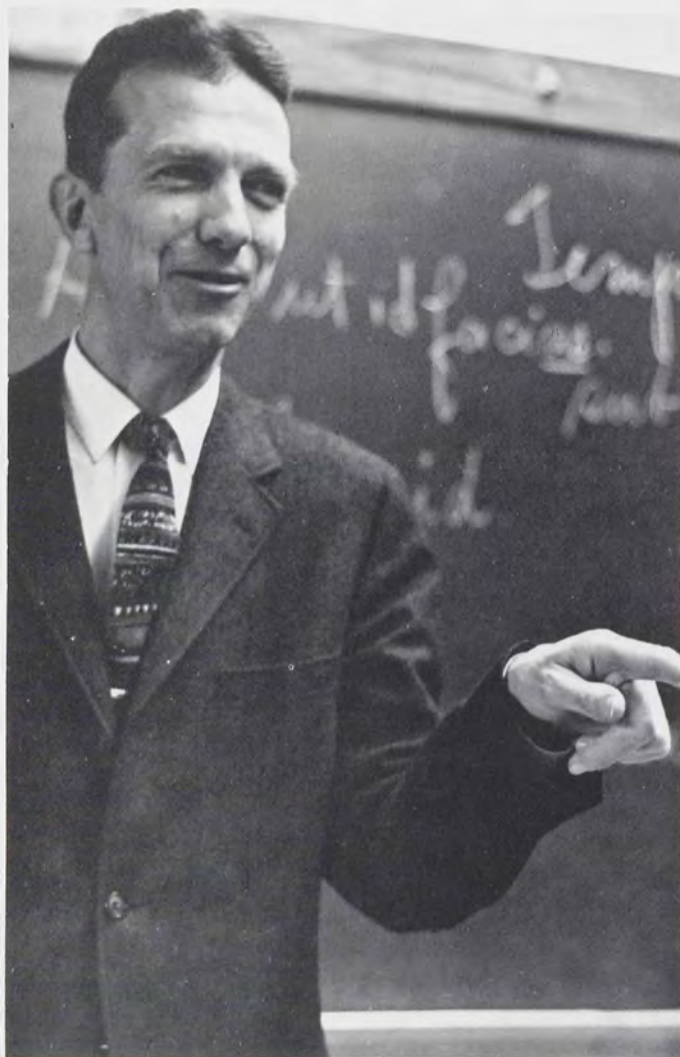

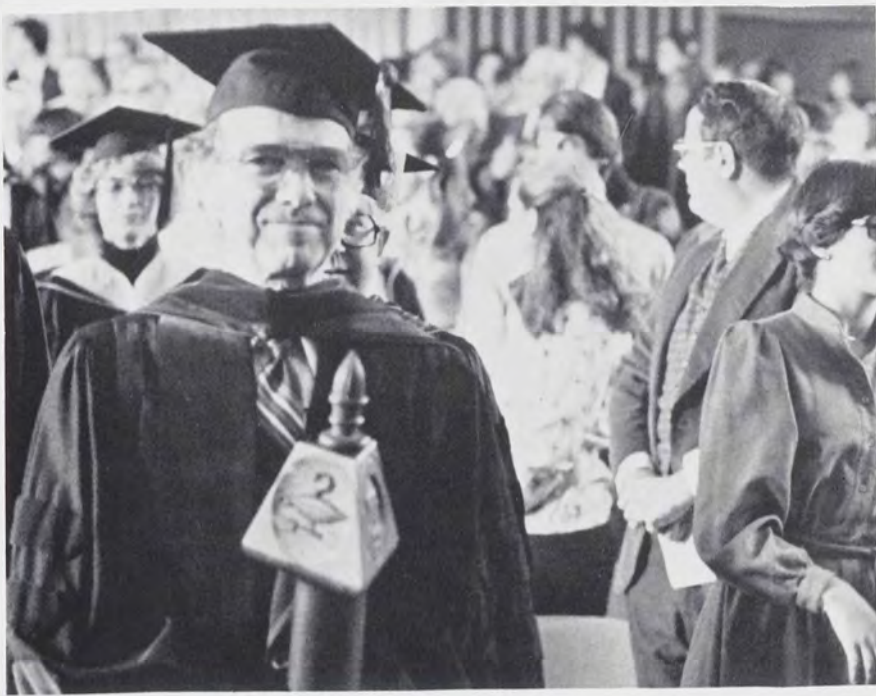

ment. Dr. Stockin was also actively involved with the Houghton Wesleyan Church.

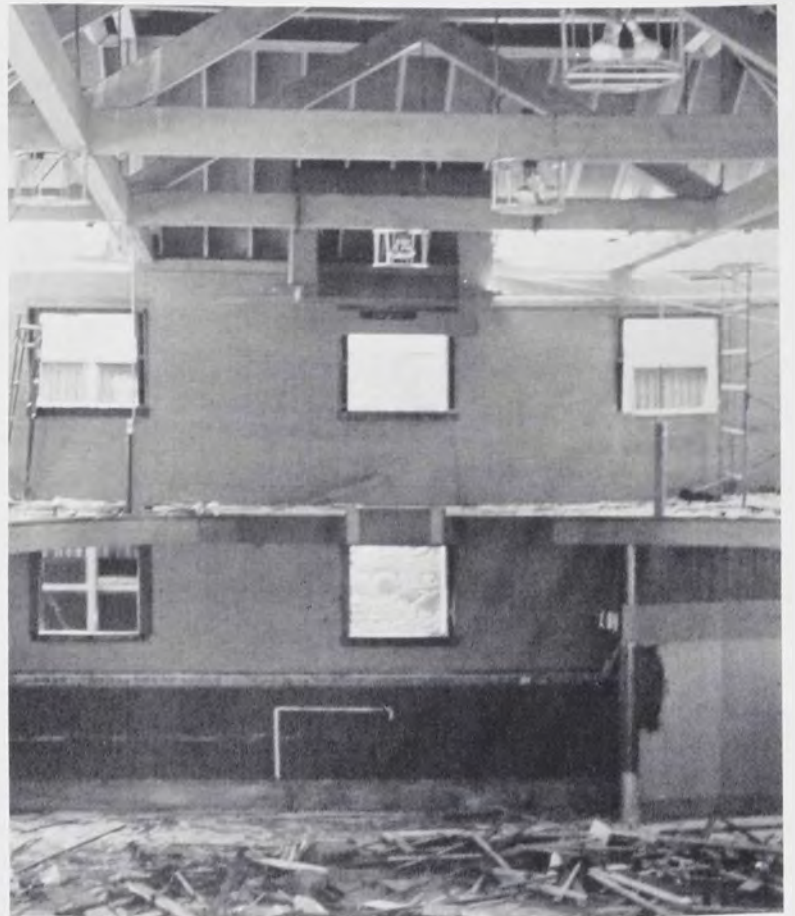
